**MONDAY.**  
**POLICE COURT.**—At the Charlottetown Police Court on Saturday morning the adjourned case of assault and battery of Edith Whitlock vs Nellie Ferguson was adjourned till July 2nd. Lawrence Doucette for keeping a malicious dog was dismissed after paying costs and sending the dog to the country. James Doherty for being drunk was fined \$3 or 10 days.

**TANGIBLE APPRECIATION.**—In the household science building this morning, says a Moncton exchange, Mr. Tuplin, a well-known fox rancher, of P. E. Island, was so taken

**FUNERAL SATURDAY.**—The funeral of the late Mr. Henry Rackam, took place at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon at the People's Cemetery. The funeral services were performed by Rev. H. E. 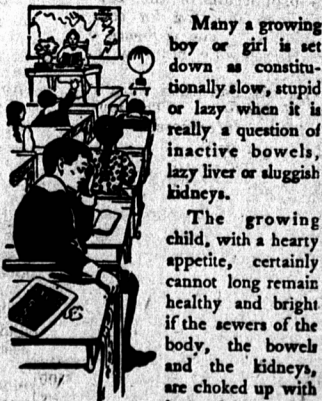
