In Memoriam

MRS. MARGARET SMITH
Much regret was expressed at the death of Mrs. Margaret A. Smith of Rollo Bay, which occurred after a lingering illness, on March 12th, at Brookline, Mass., at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Hamilton Dineen.

DOYLE REPLIES TO THE BISHOPS
LONDON, May 10.—Conan Doyle, staunch disciple of spirit communication, cabled the Cross Atlantic Service the following reply to the four British bishops who recently issued a public denunciation of spiritualism in which they deplored spreading the belief of communication with the dead:

"Such protests delay but cannot hinder progress. Reform must prevail. It is extraordinary in these prelates to see the subtle form of materialism that clothes itself in the outward trappings of religion.

"In spiritualism with its definite proofs of independent post-mortem existence, there is such enforcement for true religion as has not been since the apostolic age. My actual experience has taught me the basic fact of supernatural religion, that spiritual evolution and improvement are objects of our existence. If the contention of the Bishop of Hereford is correct, we should expect to find a high rate of lunacy among the spiritual communities now numerous in England. This is notoriously not so. They are a remarkably healthy people and contribute far fewer than their quota to asylums. Spiritualism has greatly increased in the last five years, while lunacy statistics show a marked decline.

"My opinion is that if it should take considerable sacrifice of human reason or life to establish so vital a proposition as personal survival it would be well worth while. The Bishop of Truro seems to confuse spiritualism with fortune telling. I assure him that spiritualism discourages the latter."

RUM TORPEDO IS THE LATEST
DETROIT, Mich., May 10.—Electrically operated torpedoes loaded with whiskey are being sent daily across the Detroit River from the Canadian to the American shore a mysterious informant told Federal officers here. Without divulging his identity, he told the result of his entirely private investigations. There are three torpedoes in use now, he said, of 10, 15 and 25 gallons capacity. They are of copper construction, with a propeller at the nose actuated by electric storage batteries. They submerge 100 feet and require about five minutes to cross the river at a point he designated only as "east of Woodward Avenue."

A red flag on one side of the river and a white one on the other comprise targets at which the operators direct their torpedoes, he said. After being caught and emptied on the American side, the torpedoes are ballasted with water and sent back. A huge torpedo of fifty gallons capacity is being constructed, he told the Federal officers.

Leon Trotzky At Polish Front
