Dr. Weir of Scotland, who is visiting in this Province, recently paid a visit to friends in Murray River and Murray Harbor North.

On March twentieth a horse twenty nine years old ran away with John Hicken of Murray Harbor North and crashed through a wire fence dragging a wood sleigh with him, however no serious damage occurred.

The mail special from Georgetown arrived in this City yesterday at 1:20, the steamer Minto having docked at 11 o'clock, with seventy five bags of mail. The Stanley crossed to Pictou and docked at 11 o'clock yesterday and will return to Georgetown this morning with a large freight, as it is understood that the warehouse at Pictou is full, with an overflow of fifteen or more cars awaiting transportation to this side all back mails have now been received in this City consequently there is none to come over today. The mail special left last night for Georgetown with mails and passengers to connect with the Minto this morning.

The newspapers have been making a great ado of late about the birth of quadruplets by a woman in Havana, but this achievement has been outdone in Prince Edward Island, where a woman gave birth to five children in one day. The mother was the wife of David Bell, laborer, of Charlottetown. She was 22 years of age, a small slight woman, weighing only ninety pounds.

The children were born in June, 1892. She first gave birth to four girls about two o'clock in the afternoon, and two hours later, to a boy. They were all perfectly developed children, weighing between two and three pounds. They were all born living, but unfortunately all died before evening. They were buried shortly afterwards.

It was the year of the World's Fair in Chicago, and the attending physician, Dr. E. D. Johnson, intended to have exhibited the children at the Fair had they lived. The mother survived and inside of a year gave birth to another child. As the first baby had been born ten months before the five referred to, she had therefore seven children within twenty-one months, a record it would be hard to duplicate anywhere else in the world.

Other children were born to her since then and she has now a large family living.

It is a strange fact that in the same room, Dr. Johnson says, ten children were born in the same year, it being a tenement house in which there were frequent changes of tenants, all of whom were poor people and moved frequently. This is the only case ever known on Prince Edward Island where five children came to one woman at a birth, but Dr. Johnson says that triplets have not been uncommon in his experience as a physician.

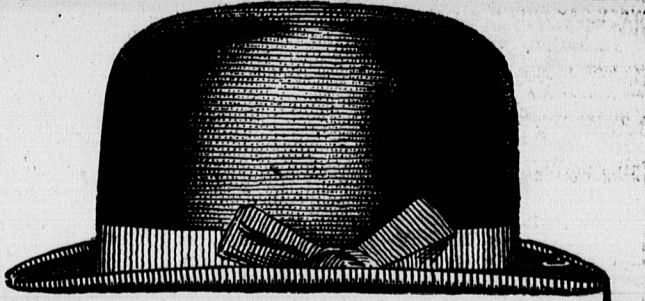
