DISCRIMINATION TO BE AVOIDED

OTTAWA, Jan. 31.—Asking the removal of a claim to be unjust discrimination against Canadian vessels, a delegation of shipping men conferred yesterday with the Board of Steamship Inspectors. At present a double inspection of boilers for vessels is necessary—one by Lloyd's, the other by the Canadian Government. A British steamer, however, may come in with Lloyd's certificate and operate in Canadian waters. It is desired that a classification certificate be accepted as sufficient, in which case the expense of a Canadian inspection will be obviated.

The delegation included Messrs J. H. Porter, of St. John, Robt. and Thos. Hall, of the Montreal Shipping Federation, and Scantlebury, the expert of Boston. There is considerable ground for the belief that the charge asked for will be made.

SMELT FISHERMEN BUYING AUTOMOBILES.

ST. JOHN, Jan. 27.—The fishermen of the province are making good

returns this winter from the smelt fishing industry. Some of them are making \$100 per day. The season for smelt netting began on December 1, but hundreds of men, women and children were engaged in fishing for themselves with hook and line. The ice has formed good and strong and fishing with hook and line was also more profitable than usual.

The fishermen are for the most part farmers who find in the smelt industry a very profitable side line during the winter months. More than one automobile has found its way into the smelt fishing region, paid for by the profits of this side line.

Last year's product was in the vicinity of 7,238,790 pounds. It is particularly a New Brunswick fish and one of the most important and valuable as seen by the record of the catch. The value of last year's catch in the province of the principal species of fish is as follows: Herring, \$820,132; lobster, \$770,078; smelt, \$551,204; cod, \$337,692; salmon, \$228,169; clams, \$260,413; oysters, \$116,040.

Last year there were 2,603 smelt nets set in these waters. There is keen competition among the buyers and the races to secure the catches when the prices are favorably low to allow of their being sent to the Boston market at a profit are most exciting. The smelt are shipped out of New Brunswick by the carload and although many of them find their way to Toronto and Montreal, the Boston fish-eaters provide the best market.

Puree of Oysters
