Buyers in Summerside are paying eighteen to twenty cents per bushel for potatoes and thirteen cents for turnips.

The schooner Winnie Hazel, sailed yesterday afternoon, for Halifax, with a good cargo of potatoes and turnips, loaded by Sinclair and Stewart Ltd., Summerside.

There has been no change in the price of produce at Summerside for the past few days. Potatoes were moving in exceptionally large quantities yesterday at eighteen to twenty cents.

The S. S. Campana sailed from Summerside for Montreal yesterday evening. Included in her cargo was perhaps one of the largest shipments of potatoes ever made at one time, from the Island to Montreal, consisting of 3800 sacks of three bushels each and 3400 bags of a bushel and a half each in all about 17000 bushels of potatoes.

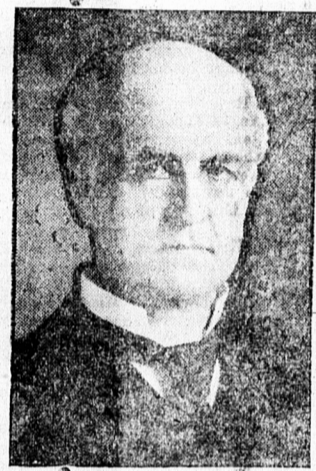

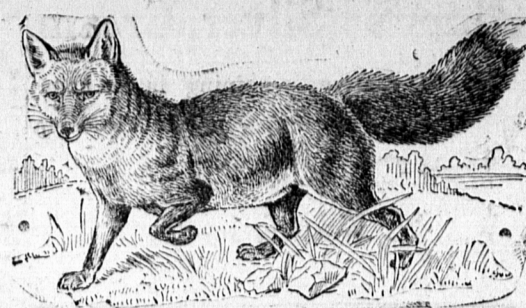
