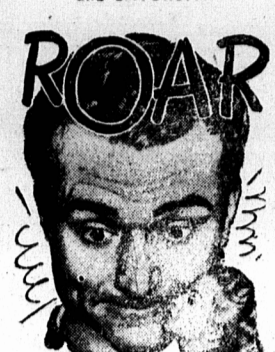

Air Force Band Will Visit Summerside

The central band of the Royal Canadian Air Force will arrive at the R.C.A.F. station Summerside this evening for a three-day stay during which it will play at a number of functions, including the inspection of the Summerside Air Cadet Squadron by Group Captain A. Lewis, A.F.C. on Monday afternoon.

A parade, including the band and two flights from the station and a flight from the Legion, will be held through the streets of the town on Sunday afternoon, commencing at 1.30 and will be followed by a band concert in Memorial Park. The parade will move off from the Queen Hotel and will pass along the following route: Water Street to Granville to Notre Dame, thence to Spring Street and the Square.

This is a thirty-piece band and it is hoped that the weather will be fine to give the people of the town an opportunity of turning out and hearing them. This concert and parade has been made possible as good will gesture by the commanding officer Squadron Leader Langstaff and the personnel of the local station.

On Sunday evening at 8.30 the band will give a concert in the station theatre to which a number of the citizens of the town have been invited.

On Monday afternoon at 3.00 o'clock the annual inspection of Number 53 Squadron Air Cadets will be held on the station parade square. The inspecting officer is Group Captain Lewis, who was for most of the war years commanding officer at Summerside. The squadron is under command of Flying Officer Norman MacLeod, Jr. and Flying Officer Elmer Pineau is second in command. The band will play for this ceremony.

On Monday evening a dance will be held at the mess for station personnel and invited guests, the music for which will be played by an 18 piece orchestra drawn from the band. This program will inaugurate the social activities of the newly re-opened station at Summerside.—S.

Former Landing Barge Purchased In Summerside

A type of ship not previously seen in Summerside harbour arrived in port yesterday afternoon about 5 o'clock and tied up at the Marine Wharf. It is a former landing barge of the U. S. Army, purchased by M. F. Schurman Co. Ltd. from the U. S. War Assets Corporation to be used in freighting lumber and other building supplies.

It is powered by three diesel motors and is 128 feet in length and 32 feet wide. It is the same type of ship as it is proposed to use on the West Point-Buctouche ferry service but smaller.

It arrived under command of Captain William Weston of Rexville, N.B., who has been freighting lumber for M. F. Schurman Co. Ltd. for forty years but always previously by a schooner. The Maud Weston, a two masted vessel was well known in Summerside for many years. The new ship will play for the most part between New Brunswick and Nova Scotia ports and Summerside. It is estimated that it should be able to carry between six and eight carloads of lumber.—S.
