FALLS TO DEATH FROM TOP OF BUILDING

BOSTON, Oct. 2.—Scores of persons attracted by men working at dizzy heights above the street on the new hotel under construction at the North Station in the late afternoon noon, witnessed the tragic fall to death of Frank McCauley, 30, of 22 Salcombe street, Dorchester, a derick engineer.

Commuters were pouring into the North Station in the late afternoon rush. Scores of them passed along the sidewalk within a few yards of the hotel structure, with no knowledge that a man was falling to his death.

Because of the accident officials of the building company ordered all work on the huge structure suspended for the day. McCauley was regarded as an expert in his line of endeavor and had been employed on building work in Boston and other large cities—Boston Exch.
