Mrs. Bjaranson and Beaucage were sentenced to two years in the St. Jerome, Que. penitentiary after their conviction in St. Jerome, Que. in February, 1948, on charges of seditious conspiracy and conspiracy to interfere with the rights of workers.

Sharp Increase In Exports To The U.K.

OTTAWA, June 1—(CP)—A sharp increase in exports to the United Kingdom brightened Canada's trade picture during April, the Bureau of Statistics reported recently.

During the month, exports to the U.K. were valued at \$63,049,000 compared with \$44,333,000 in April last year. Total exports to all countries were \$37,830,000, compared with \$216,800,000 the previous month and \$212,300,000 in April, 1948.

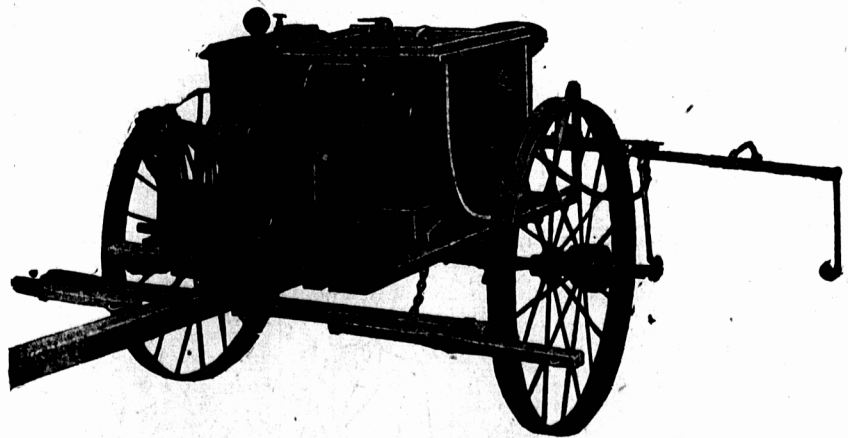

Miss Roma Rodd spent the weekend at the home of Miss Olga Ford.

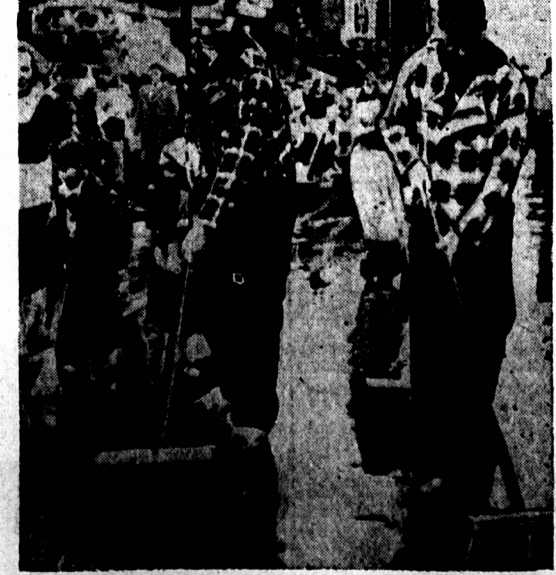
