The Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, Jan. 20 — (AP) — Trading in the usually erratic rye futures leveled off considerably Saturday as a commission house met virtually all the demand of buyers and held prices close to the previous close most of the time.

WINNIPEG, Jan. 20 — (CP) — Rye futures prices were irregular and lower than Friday in trading on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange Saturday. Trading was fairly active with good commission house buying with offerings from local interests more liberal.

NEW YORK, Jan. 20 — (AP) — Stocks with scattered exceptions, hit the downgrade in Saturday's short session, fastest for more than six years, as the imminent country-wide steel strike inspired further liquidation by discouraged holders.

The day's losses of one to four points were widespread despite the reduction of extreme setbacks in the final half hour. Trading was moderately but finished well on the downside. A number of low-quoted utilities made a little headway. Turnover for the two hours of 1,680,000 was the largest for a similar stretch since Sept. 2, 1939. The six-day aggregate of 14,650,000 was a top since the week concluded May 18, 1940.

The Associated Press 60-stock average was off 7 of a point at 78.5 but for the week showed a gain of as much.

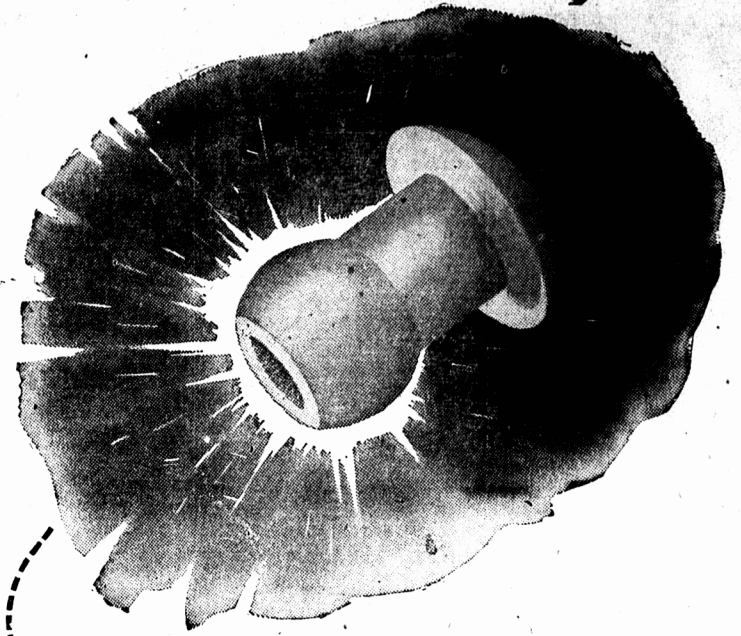
