VERDICT OF THE CORONER'S JURY

Further particulars of the accidental death by drowning of the late Allan McLean, Amherst, brought by his brothers, J. L. and A. J. McLean, Amherst, who accompanied the body to this city last night, state that there are no definite facts in connection with the fatality, with the exception that the finding of the coroner's jury empanelled on the case was the verdict that the deceased came to his death by accidental drowning from the steamer Magdalen in Eastern Harbor last Sunday evening.

EXPRESS OFFICE ROBBER CONFESSED

TRURO, Nov 1—The rigors of the third degree administered by Detective Walsh are responsible for a statement made tonight, unconfirmed by the authorities, but reasonably well supported in semi-official quarters, that the Canadian Express hold-up man now in custody here has broken down and made a partial confession, the principal feature of which is the implication in the robbery of a man not a native of Nova Scotia, but who is known to several Truro people, and bears a distant relationship to a well-known Colchester family.

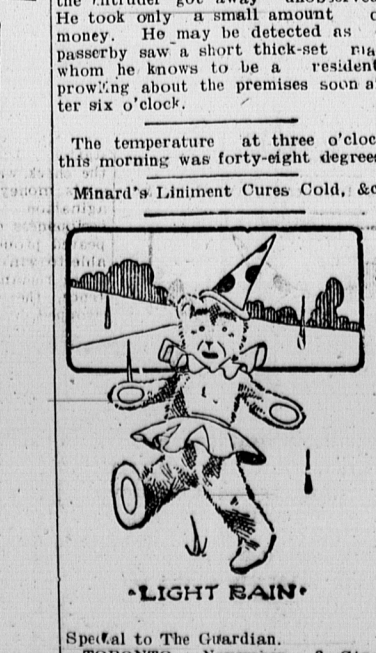
ADDRESS OF WELCOME

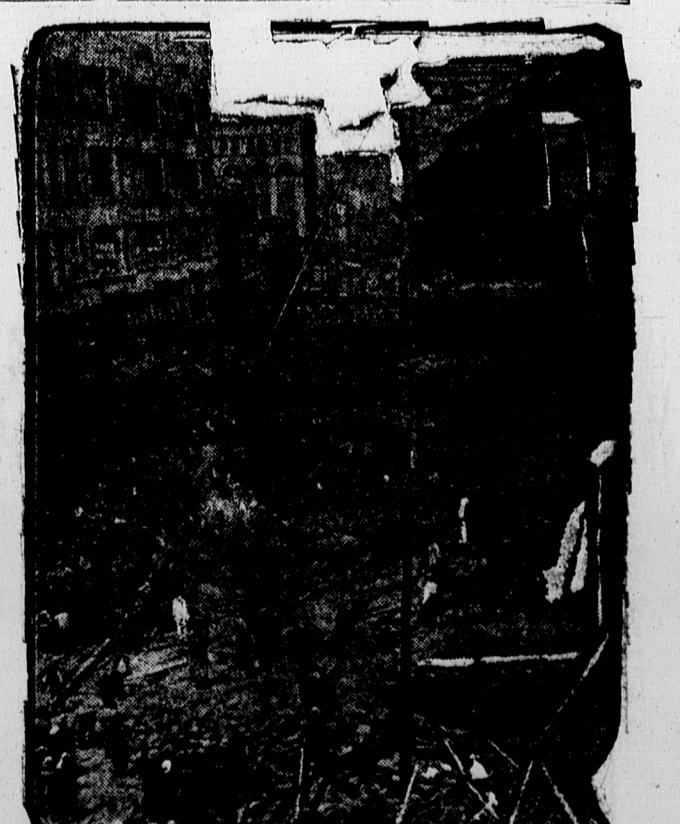
