SLOWLY THE JAPS ARE ADVANCING

But Steadily Towards Retreating Russians in the Vicinity of Mukden

CHOLERA REPORTED AT PORT ARTHUR

Fighting Said to be Going on Near Port Arthur - A Furious Assault on the Citadel - Fighting as in a Furnace.

CHOLERA AT PORT ARTHUR. St. Petersburg, Sept. 24. (Special.) - It is said that cholera has broken out in Port Arthur but no details have been received.

REPORTS OF FIGHTING. LONDON, Sept. 24. (Special.) - Reports are current of recent heavy fighting around Port Arthur.

JAPS SLOWLY ADVANCING. The Japanese are continuing to advance north with extreme slowness but it is believed that the Japanese are preparing on actually causing the Russians to evacuate Mukden.

RECALLED TO RUSSIA. Mayor General Oloff who was blamed for the Liao Yang defeat is being recalled to Russia.

PARIS, Sept. 14. - The Mat's St. Petersburg correspondent telegraphs as follows: -

"Telegrams of which the General Staff have as yet no knowledge, reached the Emperor at four o'clock this morning. I can affirm that they concern Port Arthur regarding which place the great-

est anxiety prevails in Court. "The Japanese are now engaged in a general assault, which is more furious than its predecessors, attacking the town on three sides simultaneously and employing their whole forces, being determined to finish the business.

"Russian mines blew up whole battalions. General Fock especially distinguished himself, directing the fire from the wall, which the Japanese reached after indescribable massacre.

"The whole of Admiral Togo's and Vice Admiral Kamimura's squadrons are aiding in the struggle, which it is feared here, will be final.

"The besieged forces are fighting as in a furnace. A perfect storm of shells are falling on the town, port and fortress from the whole hill and roadstead.

"General Stoessel is going from fort to fort encouraging the defenders in their desperate efforts.

"In St. Petersburg the facts concerning the tragic event, which perhaps will terminate by a glorious fall of Port Arthur, are wholly unknown. At Court hope has not yet been entirely abandoned."

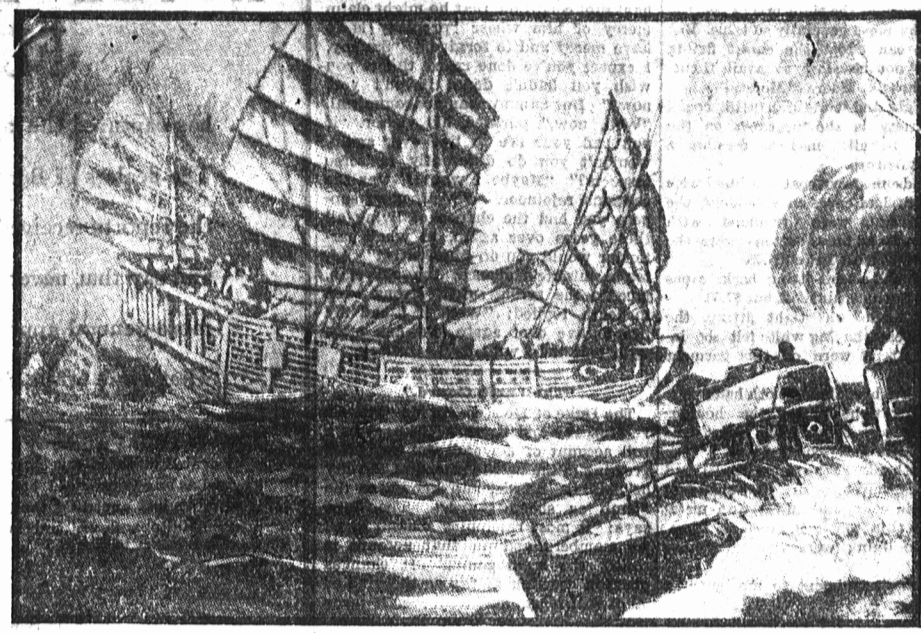
