## ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

At noon yesterday James Hennessey truckman met with a painful accident. His horse took fright from the steamroller, which was stationed at the corner of Great George and Euston Street and ran away throwing Mr. Hennessey off and two wheels of the sloop, on which he was driving, passed over his head. The Guardian was shown yesterday afternoon the Embalmer's Diploma won by G. Dudley Wright by examination while in attendance at the recent Canadian Embalmers Association at Toronto. There were 75 members in attendance including 25 taking examinations for diplomas. Two only of the latter were successful in securing the coveted honor, and Mr. Wright was one, winning 1st place and making 110 marks out of 140. An embalmers diploma is recognized by the Ontario Legislature and Baggage Masters' Association, and a body embalmed by the holder of such diploma can be transported without a certificate from the Board of Health or other official preliminaries. Mr. Wright has received the first diploma of this kind issued to the Maritime Provinces. Arrangements have been made by which examinations for the above diploma can be taken here before Mr. Wright, as President of the M. F. D. A., the papers to be sent up to Toronto for correction.

CYRUS S. Ching, who formerly lived at Red Point, P. E. Island has advanced rapidly in the service of the Boston Elevated Railway Company, which he entered two years ago as a motorman. When the overhead system was opened as he was transferred to the elevated trains, for which many of the best men in the company's employ were selected at that time. He has acted as equipment inspector most of the time since, and has now been regularly appointed to that position. Although such promotion is rapid, it is in line with the Boston Elevated Company's policy of giving efficiency in its service prompt recognition.
