British Air Cadets Due In S'ide Today

The British Air Cadets which are touring Canada, will arrive at the Summerside airport this afternoon at 4 o'clock and will be entertained here. Tomorrow they will go to Charlottetown, where they will be met by the Lieutenant-Governor and the Premier of the Province. They will be greeted on arrival here this afternoon by members of the local squadron, the R.C.A.F. and by members of the Local and Provincial Air Cadet Committees. They will be entertained at dinner in the station mess and in the evening will be guests at a theatre party in town on Saturday morning. They will go to Charlottetown and will visit places of interest, including the Confederation Chamber in the Provincial Building. Mr. L. W. Shaw, Deputy Minister of Education, will confer with British connections with Prince Edward Island. They will be entertained at Government House and will have luncheon at the restaurant. In the afternoon they will leave by air for Halifax where they are due to arrive at 4 p.m.

Rev. L.P. and Mrs. Archibald, Brooklyn, N. S., are at the sea side cottage of Cyril McFarlane's, Fernwood.

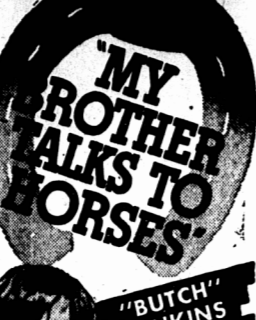

WALL EXERCISE AIDS SWAY BACK

"When you correct a 'sway back' that overly-scooped stretch of spine, you straighten out two figure faults which owe their untimely plight to this wayward curve. One is a spotlighted tummy. The other is a bounding hipline.

To correct a sway, straighten out your posture, says a noted salon exercise instructor. A sway-back girl who goes to her classes is taught realignment of posture and given exercises that help to keep curves in their proper places.

Is this your problem? Want to correct it? Well, here's the routine: first back up to a wall. With feet a few inches forward lean back against it. Extend arms overhead and touch the wall with elbows and the back of your hands. Press entire spine against the wall.
