A company, New Brunswick Seed Potatoes, Ltd., has been organized by leading shippers and growers of the central and upper St. John River Valley for the handling of the South American export trade, which will consist principally of the shipping of potatoes.

A tremendous revival of democracy has been evident in the past few years, Rev. J. King Gordon, travelling secretary for the Fellowship for a Christian Social Order, told a meeting in Hertz Hall last night. Since the war democracy has actually been in retreat, he said, and it is now being fought to make the world safe for democracy. It was easy to understand, however, for throughout the war a great deal of centralized control was necessary and after the war countries were slow to shake it off. Since shortly after the war there had been a struggle between the forces of dictatorship and the forces of democracy but now it looked as though the dictatorships were in retreat, the speaker said.
