Sea Bathing.

Those who are suffering from disease or weakness of any form should not bathe in the sea without first consulting a medical man, and anyone not accustomed to it needs to be careful, especially if the weather is either very hot or cold.

The best time is between ten and twelve o'clock in the morning; but there is no reason why one should not bathe at any part of the day, except for an hour after meals. Bathing interferes with digestion, and therefore to be avoided at such times.

The material of which bathing-dress of women serge is best. Don't bathe after perspiring freely, or when chilly.

Don't unless you are an expert, attempt to swim if the tide is running out; you may be very quickly be carried to a considerable distance from the shore, and returning under these circumstances is always difficult, and sometimes impossible.

Have a light lunch after dressing, and if you feel at all chilly go for a short brisk walk.

Dairy and Creamery.

John Riddick, at the annual meeting of the Eastern Dairy Society, described pasteurization as simply a process to kill and render neutral by high heat the things in milk and cream which should not have fallen to them.
