THE KING'S CORONATION.

It is so long since the solemnities attendant upon the coronation of a Sovereign have been witnessed in the British Islands that the elaborate preparations for the official crowning of King Edward are awakening much interest throughout the Empire. In the earlier ages the ceremony of coronation was prerequisite to entrance upon Kingly power, just as a judge must be first duly appointed and sworn before he can discharge any judicial duties; but where the order of succession is perfectly established, as in the case of King Edward, his authority is considered as beginning with the death of his predecessor, and the coronation is mainly a ceremonial consecration.

The ceremony of coronation is both religious and political, and includes the anointing of the Sovereign in a ceremonial way; the investing with certain robes or garments forming a consecrated dress; the bestowal or assumption of the sceptre, sword and orb, and the placing of the crown upon the head. The great dignitaries of the church and the state take part in, or are witnesses of the ceremony. And in England a special record is made, known as the coronation roll, in which the particulars of the ceremony are engrossed on vellum, reciting the coronation oath taken and subscribed by the Sovereign, and the names of the notable persons present, who do homage at the close of the ceremony.

In the British Empire where the King is subject to the constitution and laws, and where Parliament claims and may exercise the right to control the succession in certain possible emergencies, the coronation is the solemn ratification of the compact between the King and his subjects. He is solemnly bound to rule justly, and they to obey his lawful behests. It is therefore fitting that the coronation should be attended with impressive observances, and that all parts of the King's dominions should be represented by prominent and duly accredited witnesses. On this occasion in June next the greatest of state ceremonies will be witnessed not only by many of the chief dignitaries, religious and political of all parts of the British Empire, but by the representatives of nearly all the Empires, Kingdoms and nations of the earth.

In reply to an inquiry as to the qualifications for enrolment in the North West Mounted Police, and the pay of the force, etc. The non-commissioned officers receive from 85 cents to \$1.50 per day; the constables receive from 50 to 75 cents per day. The standard for service in the ranks is: Minimum age 23 years; height 5 feet 8 inches; chest 35 inches; and the maximum weight 175 pounds. The term of engagement is five years. All members of the force are mounted at the public expense. The officers furnish their own uniforms, but the non-commissioned officers and men are supplied with uniforms.

A commercial man coming from Sydney to Charlottetown a few days ago remarked upon the loss of time between New Glasgow and Pictou. The Sydney train on the day referred to arrived at New Glasgow at 2.20 p. m. local time, stayed there 20 minutes and reached Stellarton, two miles distant at 2.55. The train left Stellarton at 3.35 and only reached Pictou, 14 miles distant, at 4.55 p. m. From the time of arrival at New Glasgow till the time of arrival at Pictou was 2 hours and 35 minutes, although the total distance is a fraction under 16 miles. For an express train making an interprovincial connection this seems very slow indeed.

It had also a substantial accompaniment in the bank cheque which was enclosed. Prof. Caven has seen long and honorable service and he retires with the respect of all. It will be gratifying to the public now that he is released from the arduous duties of teaching if Prof. Caven will devote his time more largely than heretofore to those literary pursuits to which his taste inclines and for which he is otherwise so well equipped.

Referring to the letter which appears another part of this paper from the Minister of Public Works to Hon. D. A. McKinnon it will be observed that Mr. Tarte sees a difficulty in the way of working the Marconi system across the Straits unless the Government also controls the land lines on this side. For that matter we think the Government ought to own and operate the entire telegraph system of Canada. But the difficulty could easily be got over in another way. The distance between Charlottetown and Cape Tormentine in a direct line is only some thirty-five miles, and the Marconi system is capable of efficiently covering a much longer distance than that. If necessary to secure an elevated position, the telegraph station could be erected on Mount Edward or Tea Hill, from which point communication could be quickly made to this city, and to all parts of the Island by telephone.
