## SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

THE SUFFERING SERVANT OF JEHOVAH.

Isa. 52: 13-53: 12.

GOLDEN TEXT.

"The Lord hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all."—Is. 53: 6.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

No one will venture to express the belief that he has reached the heights or sounded the depths of meaning in the consideration of which we are led by to-day's lesson. No matter by what ladders, or plummets, or process of reasoning and faith and exalted imagination the reverent student would attain to an understanding of the ways of God which are here outlined, he can only reach limits where his wondering soul is baffled and his heart overwhelmed by those mysteries of love in which he gladly loses himself by the plunge of enraptured adoration: "Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and His ways past finding out!"

But take notice that the difficulties of interpretation and understanding in the lesson are not because of any obscurity in the language of the mighty theme and of the history through which it has been revealed to men. Look at the title of the lesson. Look, and look again, and again look.

Remember that it was from this portion of scripture that Philip, the evangelist, preached Jesus, the Crucified, to the Ethiopian until he made a credal confession, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." Remember that when Peter made the same confession to the Man of Nazareth he was told that it was beyond the powers of flesh and blood to have revealed it to him, and that the only solution of it could be given, namely, that it came to him from the Father which is in heaven.

Accordingly, the inquiry remains: "Who hath believed our report," etc. A conquering Messiah men were waiting for. One who would restore the kingdom again to Israel the children of Abraham would receive. While Jesus Christ wrought miracles and fed the people he was not without followers, even a great host, but a suffering servant of Jehovah—that was another thing. At this hour, alas, it still is another thing. "Who hath believed our report?"

The sufferings of Jesus even unto the death of the cross were predetermined sufferings. And they were as truly vicarious as predetermined. And they were as definitely necessary as they were vicarious, if fallen, wayward, sinful man should find salvation. What packed meaning there is in the dying word of Jesus on the cross none know: "It is finished." Nevertheless, every soul who is sung from that output of the mercy of our God.

But satisfaction, and joy, and spoil have come to one who poured out His soul unto death. Would He not rejoice over the surrender of our lives to Him? The value of the lesson depends upon making it personal. Write it in that way. And then write in the name of another and of another; and thus make it world-wide and age-long; none are excluded.

Of course, this lesson will be read and studied, verse by verse. Nothing can be omitted. Ask the questions which the repentant and breaking heart suggests and which the believing and grateful soul prompts. The Holy Spirit will illumine. Human speech can do little. At one moment, reconciliation, salvation—the vision of Jesus—these are realized only through the offices of a witnessing spirit.

### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

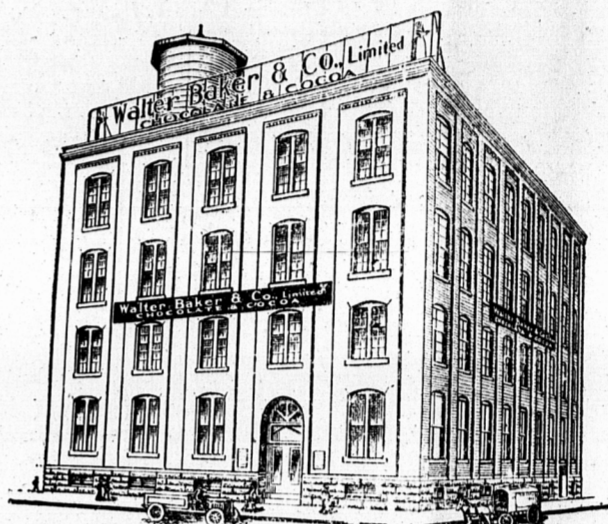
ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by either, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on an arm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may preempt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$200 per acre. Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchase homestead.—Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.
