New Queen of Amphibian Planes



Nearly twice as large as any other amphibian plane is the Giesse L. Martin Co.'s new twin-engine XP2M-5A, above, pictured during its recent first flight. Similar in design to Martin's PBM Mariner, an outstanding rough-water patrol plane, it is expected to be especially valuable for air-sea rescues. The new ship weighs approximately 30 tons, is powered by two 2100-hp engines, is 80 feet in length, has 118-foot wingspan, cruises at 147 mph. with speed maximum of 200 mph. Nose wheel retracts into foot and side wheels fold into side of hull. Turret atop fuselage is a radar dome.

U. S. 'Phone Strike Affecting Canada

MONTEAL, Jan. 11.—(CP)—Trans-Atlantic telephone communication between Canada and Britain has been substantially interrupted and calls between the Dominion and seven American cities, including Washington, Newark, N. J., Philadelphia, Pittsburgh and Cleveland. Only emergency calls to them were being completed by the American operators and the number of calls coming to Canada from there indicated that they were being cut through only in emergency too.
