ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

Reporters and Correspondents Everywhere.

At the March quarterly meeting of the Cornwall Methodist circuit the board gave the Rev. W. B. Thomas an unanimous invitation for the fourth year.

At the Police Court yesterday two drunks Wm. Nowlan and Joseph Cameron were fined \$1 or 15 days and \$5 or 30 days respectively. The Prohibition cases of Jenkin's vs Henry Josey and Campbell vs. John Collins were adjourned for a week. Patrick Doherty confessed to a sale and was fined \$100. The case against Andrew Doyle was dismissed and the one against Patrick Doherty for special sale was adjourned for a week. Jenkin's was prosecutor in each.

A delegation consisting of the executive of the Provincial Teachers' Association waited upon the Government yesterday and urged upon the Government "the desirability of so amending the regulations governing the schools of this Province, so that the holidays in all schools be held in the months of July and August. It was also urged upon the Government the desirability of giving such recognition to the Summer School of Science as will insure frequent meetings of the school in this province. The delegation was very cordially received and the most favorably and serious consideration of the Government promised to the subjects presented.
