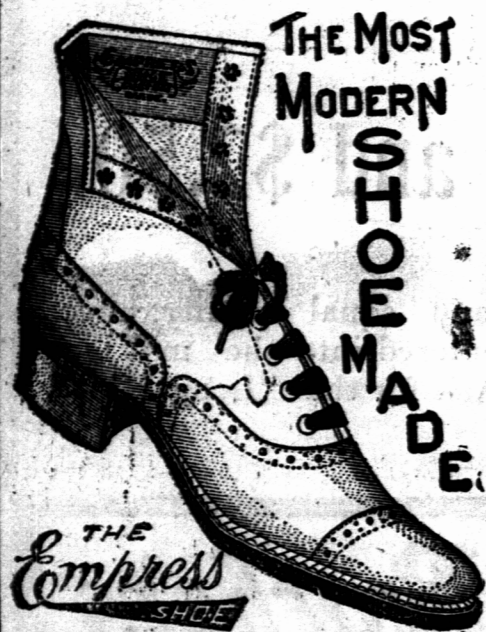

Latest from Summerside and Prince County.
