THE JUDGES ARRAIGNED.

The Toronto News boldly arraigns some Ontario and western judges for misconduct of various kinds calculated to shake the public confidence in their integrity and impartiality. The instances cited may be briefly recounted here. The first instance has to do with an inquiry by commission into corrupt election practices. Three County Court judges accepted a commission to enquire into the election results in West Elgin. The News says "they made a report so pitifully weak and farcical that it was regarded contemptuously even by the politicians who were responsible for its work and its findings." Again in regard to the West Huron and Brockville election scandals three judges were appointed to make inquiry and with what result? "A saw-off was arranged between the parties, no evidence was offered, no inquiry was attempted. The judges were content to sanction the immoral compromise, to make no attempt to conduct an independent investigation or even to express indignation at the poor farce to which they were made a party."

Again, the Gamey commission composed of judges is cited and condemned, "not that it censured Gamey, but that it acquitted Stratton, a gross perversion of justice and a scandal to the Canadian Judiciary." In the more recent case in Prince Albert, we are told Judge Pendergast "counted for the Liberal candidate votes which were cast in the names of dead men, infants and women and even votes which were cast outside the constituency in which the election was held. At least this was a slavish adherence to technicality, an amazing contempt for equity, a curious degradation of judicial office to irresponsible routine."

Furthermore The News recalls that two years ago protests were entered against certain Liberal members of the Commons in Manitoba, including Hon. Mr. Sifton. And yet the date for the trial of these petitions has not yet been fixed. Parliament will shortly meet and these petitions cannot now be tried until next summer. This means that three years will have elapsed and Parliament will have almost run its course before these elections can be investigated. Witnesses will have died or disappeared and the petitioners will be at an enormous disadvantage. Such a delay of justice is a practical denial of justice.

Be it also observed that in every one of these cases above cited the Liberal party or some Liberal politician has profited by the failure, or delay, or denial of justice. The News which makes these charges is by no means antagonistic to the Laurier Government. Its editor, Mr. Williston was formerly the editor in chief of the Toronto Globe, and is also the author of a highly appreciative biography of Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

Furthermore The News calls attention to the open and flagrant defiance of the law by certain Ontario judges. A year ago the salaries of the judges were increased and it was provided that they should not sit upon financial boards or engage in other business pursuits. But The News affirms that "there are judges even in Toronto who still sit upon financial boards in brazen defiance of the law while ostentatiously preaching observance of the law from the bench and applying penalties for breach of its provisions." Are these grave charges true or untrue? If true they constitute a scandal of the greatest and most menacing magnitude. If untrue these charges are a slander and libel upon the judiciary which the judges have full power to punish, and they ought to exercise that power.

We fear that the charges are true and that the judges whose integrity is thus boldly impugned have no defence to make. Fortunately the superior court judges of the eastern Provinces have set a higher standard for themselves, and follow the best traditions of the courts of the Mother Country in their personal conduct and judicial work. But it is an ill day for Canada when in any part of the Dominion those who are appointed to sit in judgment over their fellows can be thus gravely impeached and do not dare to deal with their accusers.

ONE JAIL FOR THE PROVINCE.

The Patriot, which speaks for the Provincial Government, says it is understood that it has been decided to hereafter have one jail for the entire Province; that the Government will accept the city's offer of a site in exchange for the present jail property, conditional upon the old site being utilized as a square and planted with trees, and that it is expected the new jail, which will be a brick and stone structure of modern design, will be erected near the park factory, on the other side of the railway track.

We heartily commend this action in its general outline. It accords with the views frequently expressed in these columns. It accords with the progressive tendencies of the age. It will tend to the improvement of our city in appearance, and to give the Province a more suitable and creditable prison than we now have. It is also a move in the direction of sound economy, as the maintenance of one new jail will cost less than the maintenance of the three present rather old and dilapidated structures which are constantly needing repairs.
