world our interest in supplying the sinews of war to our great Dominion's effort, but it will show the loyal and whole-hearted response of many of our citizens who probably are very small wage earners. This is a Loan in which everyone can play a part, everyone from the richest to the poorest can participate and be a full partner even though they do not don a uniform of any of our forces.

The Dominion's Finance Minister, Hon. J. L. Lasky, who has carried on his duties so magnificently, is sure that Canadians, fighting for their existence, will demonstrate to the world their faith in their country, in their cause and in eventual victory, by the response they will make to this new appeal. In this response the people of Prince Edward Island, although small in area and population, will show themselves worthy of being a separate province of our broad Dominion.

The new National War Finance Committee will be headed by the same chairman as the last one, Mr. G. W. Spinney of Montreal. His work has been so outstanding that no other name could be more fitting to head our great war loan drive. For weeks he has been hard at work organizing the details with other self-sacrificing men, and these will soon be announced giving particulars of the interest rate and yield of the bonds.

Widespread Canvass

The work of organizing Prince Edward Island's part in the second Victory Loan has been in progress and is now almost completed. It is planned to conduct an intensive "all out" campaign to give everyone — whether resident of city, town, village or rural country-side — an opportunity to do his or her share by subscribing to the Loan. The Provincial Headquarters will be at 57 Queen Street, Charlottetown, in the former Telephone building. This building is a most suitable one for the purpose.
