CONGREGATIONAL MEETING.—The annual meeting of the Murray Harbor Presbyterian congregation was held in the Peters' Road Church on Tuesday afternoon. The session reported development in spiritual things. A number of names had been added to the Communion Roll, and the Family Altar set up in many homes. The attendance at the services of Public Worship continues to be thoroughly representative of the homes. Four Sunday Schools are doing good work and report successful outside work done by cradle rolls and home assignments in some sections. Groups of Tuxis Boys and Trail Rangers have been organized. A teacher training class made good, and five members received diplomas. Two Bible Classes, made up of men only, reported an interesting year of instructive meetings. Two Women's Missionary Auxiliaries reported an exceptionally good year, and the Ladies Aid Societies both did splendid work. Former Red Cross enthusiasm was directed to orphanage work with satisfactory results. The B'nai B'rith was remembered, and worthy philanthropic demands supported. The schemes of the church and general congregational revenue were contributed to through the Duplex Envelope system, and the ministers salary (which was paid monthly) made up to the standard set by the last Assembly.

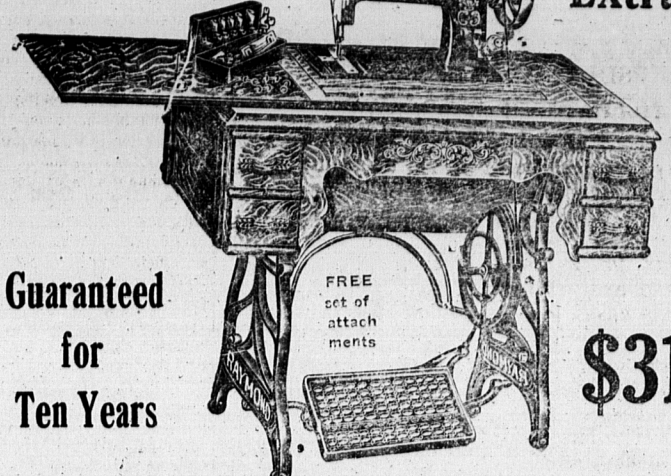
PERSONALS

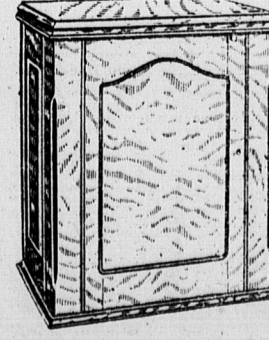
