TEA AT ELMIRA

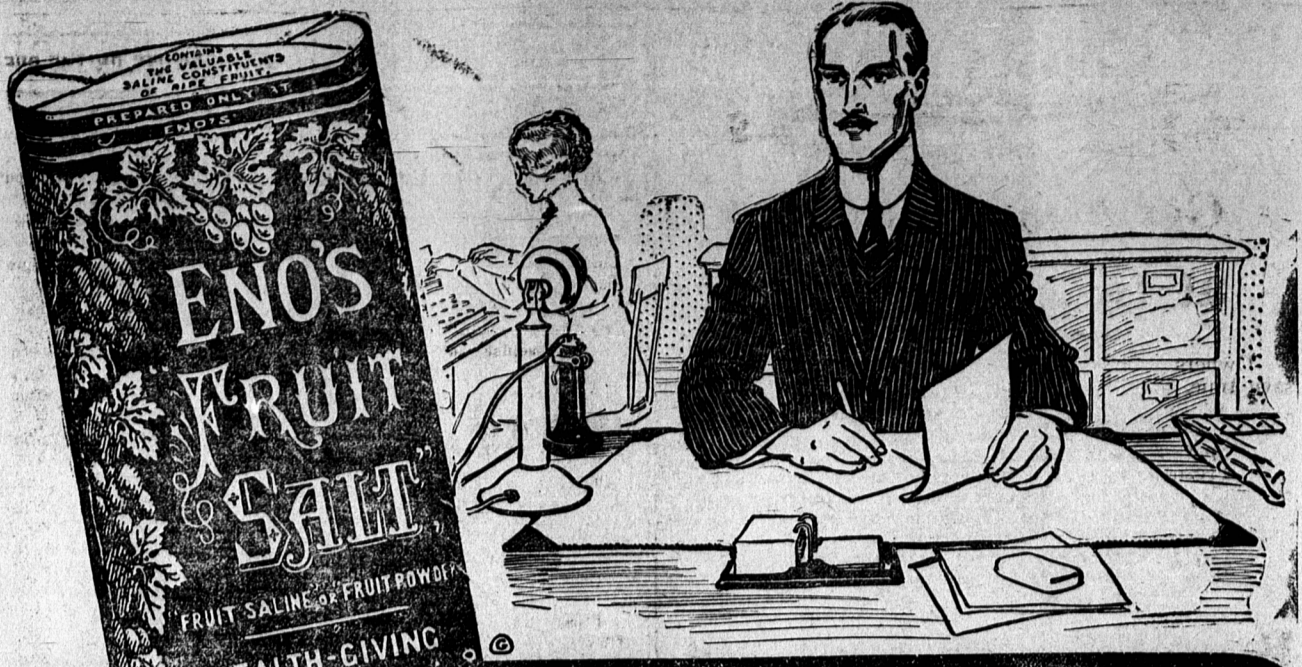
The parishioners of East Point parish intend holding a grand Tea at Elmira Station on Tuesday July 7th in aid of St. Columba's Church.
