POSTMASTER IS COMMITTED FOR TRIAL.

Dalhousie Man Confessed that he and Chifferton Robbed the Post Office.

DALHOUSIE, N. B., March 17.—The Story of the robbing of Dalhousie Post Office of \$500 on July 30 last, was told before Magistrate Smith at the preliminary examination of J. A. Johnson, the postmaster who is charged with the crime. The story is a strange one. Some weeks ago, George Chifferton, a Dalhousie man who left in August to work in Rat Portage, Man., received a package of candy from New Brunswick. He divided it with friends and all took sick. Poison was suspected and Chifferton was arrested. On him were found letters which referred to the Post Office robbery at Dalhousie and led to Postmaster Johnson's arrest.

Chifferton was brought here and to-day swore that Johnson suggested the robbing to him and arranged so that he could break into the Office on the night of July 30 when there was some \$500 on hand. He said that he did so and divided with Johnson.

Detective Chamberlain who arrested Johnson, testified that Johnson gave him a written statement that he and Chifferton had committed the robbery and this confession was placed in evidence. Johnson called no witnesses and was committed for trial next Tuesday.

In regard to the charge against Johnson for sending poisoned candy through the mails, application was made for a remand until the 22nd, as the Crown's witnesses from Northern Ontario have not arrived. The application was granted.

BIG ELECTRIC DEAL.

MONTREAL, March 17.—It is learned at midnight that the great electric deal has been accomplished. The Royal Trust Co., of Montreal has taken over the Lachine Co. in trust for the Montreal Light, Heat and Power Co. paying for the same \$100 per share or \$3,800,000. This places all the companies on the Island of Montreal as well as the Shawanigan Company under one management. The sum above mentioned is to be paid twenty-five per cent cash and the balance in sixty days. The man who engineered this great deal is Mr. Rodolphe Forget.
