Breeding Ewes For Early Lambs

As there is a scarcity of lambs on all markets throughout the Dominion in the months of May, June and July, it naturally follows that the price received by breeders is considerably higher during these months than for lambs of the late summer and fall grass. There is then a real incentive for lamb raising by farmers who have the proper buildings, the right feeds and understand essentials in feeding and management.

Ewes bred the first part of October will lamb early in March. March lambs should be ready for the market the latter part of June or early July, at a time when the holiday season is getting under way, when the tourist trade is at its height and when there is a growing demand for fresh killed lamb. Farmers who are well equipped for raising early lambs should give the matter of having the ewes bred in October immediate consideration.

Ewes require approximately two months after the lambs are weaned before they breed successfully. Experiments in both Canada and the United States, indicate that to secure a large lamb crop one of the essentials is to have the ewes gaining in flesh at time of breeding. In Eastern Canada and on grain farms in the West, hay meadows ad stubble fields usually carry sufficient aftermath and grain for flushing purposes for the average farm flocks. If the ewes are very thin a quarter to a half pound of whole oats is recommended.

Where ewes are bred for early lambs, lambing takes place before warm weather, consequently ewes must be lambed out in a warm building. The period of pregnancy for a breeding ewe is 145 to 147 days so that in the case of early lambing, careful records must be kept of breeding dates so that ewes may be coming to lambing time will be removed to a box stall in the main barn or to warm quarters.

Lambs dropped the latter part of February or early March when a few days old will stand a lot of cold, and the ewes with their lambs may be moved back to the regular sheep pen provided it is free from draughts and is dry and well bedded down with straw. Ewes with lambs at foot should be housed in the warmest and most sheltered part of the sheep barn.
