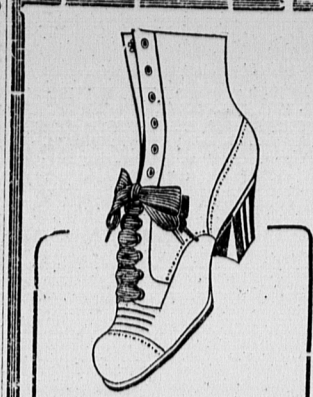

Unfavorable weather prevented the gathering of Monday evening in the Vernon River church a very interesting and successful meeting was held.

Hullifox Echo: The engagement is announced of S. C. Oland, son of G. W. C. Oland, Halifax, and Miss Hermina de Bedia, daughter of Sr. Antonio de Bedia, of Havana, Cuba. Miss de Bedia is well known in Halifax, having received her education at Mount St. Vincent. The wedding will take place about the middle of January at Havana. (Mr. Oland is well known here).

The death occurred at his home at Seaview on Oct. 16th of Lorne Campbell, aged 29 years, one of the most respected young men of that locality. The deceased had only been ill a short time and succumbed to an attack of typhoid fever. He leaves to his widow besides his widowed mother, Hugh, residing near the homestead, William and James, in British Columbia, Robert, at home, and Mrs. John S. Cousins, Park Corner. The funeral took place on Wednesday Oct. 18th from his late residence to the Geddie Memorial Cemetery, Rev. Mr. Sutherland officiating at the services. There was a very large attendance at the funeral, showing clearly the esteem in which the deceased was held.

In the death of Arthur Ernest Williams, manager of the local branch of the Bank of New Brunswick, which occurred Tuesday afternoon, Moncton loses one of its most valued, highly esteemed and useful citizens. The deceased was a member of the Masonic order, the I.O.O.F. and the Royal Arcanum, as well as being a charter member of the Moncton City Club. As a member of St. George's church and choir he was a regular attendant at that church, his services being highly appreciated. Although it was realized for some days past that there was little chance of his recovery from the complications which followed an attack of typhoid fever, yet Mr. Williams' death came as a severe blow to his numerous friends in this city and elsewhere. Deceased had been in very poor health since the commencement of the summer, but was only confined to his bed since the 21st of September. On October 16th he was removed to the city hospital to undergo an operation. The late Mr. Williams was forty-two years of age and was a son of Albert Williams, of Biddeford, P.E.I. who predeceased him nine years ago. He had been connected with banking for the past twenty-one years. For several years he was with the Bank of Nova Scotia in Charlottetown. From there he removed to St. John in the employ of the Bank of New Brunswick at that place. From there he was transferred to Moncton to take charge of the Bank of New Brunswick here. He is survived by his widow, who was formerly Miss Dora Dunbar, of Guelph, Ont., one son, Reginald Dunbar, aged seven years, and one daughter, Dorothy Mary, aged five years. His mother, four brothers and one sister also survive. The sister is Mrs. M. J. McLeod, of Edmonton, Alta. The brothers are Beecher, of Summerside; Bayfield, of Edmonton; R. Clifford, manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia at Sackville, and Claude, who still resides at the old home in Biddeford, P. E. I.—Moncton ex.

The price of milk has been a live topic in this city recently—advance in the price from five to six cents per quart having caused quite a stir among householders until it was finally withdrawn and the old nickel standard resumed. The citizens of New York are now paying eight cents per quart and the milk dealers are now advancing the price one cent per quart.

Alex. R. Johnston of the I.R.C., and little daughter, Ella, who were attending the funeral of the late Mrs. Albert Johnson, of Halifax, returned to the city. Mrs. Johnson is survived by her husband, one daughter, Mrs. Alex. R. Johnston, of Sydney, two sons, John A., Halifax, and Amos N. of Wellesley Hills, Mass. Mrs. Johnston was formerly Catherine McPherson (Thomas) of Orwell, P. E. I.—Sydney ex.

It is likely that the Rosalind will make two more trips to Montreal before the closing of navigation. After that she will lay up for repairs previous to resuming her place on the St. John's Halifax, New York route. There are large quantities of freight now awaiting shipment in Montreal, and the Black Diamond Line did well to charter the S. S. 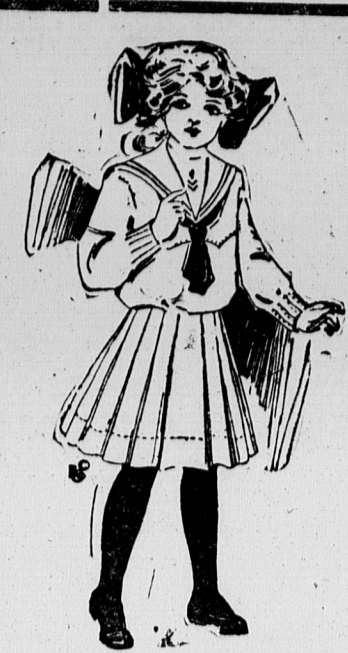
