The call for Canadian horses abroad still continues. Thousands have been sent to France and Europe this year. For many years Canadian horses have been used in the British West Indies for police work. Recently another consignment went forward to Barbados at the request of the Commissioner of Police at Bridgetown. Six horses were bought for him by the Dominion Department of Agriculture. Four of the horses were for police work and two were mares of riding type. Another horse was shipped to a railway official in Bermuda.

Reports received from the Chief Veterinary Officer of the Leeward Islands Department of Agriculture state that the French-Canadian mares and three stallions imported by the Dominion Department of Agriculture a few months ago are proving very satisfactory, and the officer asks for another stallion to be purchased and sent to the island of Montserrat.

Flew From England For Last Farewell

The story of how a grief-stricken mother was rushed in an R. A. F. plane from Bristol, England, to the open grave of her son here in Montreal, was told to The Star by Mrs. Annie T. Pond, (formerly of Summerside), mother of the late Flying Officer Stephen Pond, who was killed in the crash of an R. A. F. Dakota in Saskatchewan on September 15.

"I never realized people could be so kind," Mrs. Pond said, telling of those harrowing days between receiving the cable informing her of her son's death, and her arrival at Mount Royal Cemetery to place flowers on his casket as it was being lowered to its last resting place.

Mrs. Pond, who lived in Montreal for a number of years, went to England to stay with a daughter in Bristol. "Stephen was one of the best Dakota pilots in the service," she said proudly, adding that her son was due for discharge but had been persuaded to undertake the terrifying job before turning to civilian life. He was one of the R.C.A.F. personnel who lost their lives in the tragic crash of their transport near Estevan.

Call to Canada House
First news of the accident reached Mrs. Pond in Bristol on September 16. A call was immediately put through to Canada House and that same day Mrs. Pond and her daughter were on their way to London. The grief-stricken mother wanted to reach Canada in time for her son's funeral, the flying being brought to Montreal by train.

Through mutual friends, Mrs. Pond next got in touch with Mrs. Chief Marshal McBirnie of the R. A. F. Transport Command, who "always had a soft spot for mothers of men who flew." The Air Marshal arranged for passage on an R. A. F. plane called for Mrs. Pond and rushed her out to the airport, but she was warned that she would have to wait until the other passengers were weighed in and that it might not be possible to find space for her.

At this point luck stepped in: a seat was found, and despite pouring rain and a near-gale, the aircraft finally took off, going first to Prestwick, Scotland, and then winging over the ocean to Gander, Newfoundland.

All Formalities Waived
In London, immigration officials had to pass Mrs. Pond's passport through in a matter of hours with a special notation that at no time during her journey was she to be detained. The aircraft, which had from Britain contacted the R. C. A. F. in Lachine, advising the time of its arrival in Dorval, and the plane had scarcely stopped moving when Mrs. Pond was taken out.

She put into a taxi and driven top speed to Mount Royal Cemetery. All formalities were waived for the mother of the dead flier, who reached her son's grave at 5 p.m. just in time to see the lowering of the flag-draped casket, and which someone had thrust into her arms.

Flying Officer Pond was buried with full military honors, and a bugler was brought from Montreal to sound the Last Post. "They were all so kind," Mrs. Pond reiterated. "No one will ever know how much I appreciate the kindness of the authorities, the R. C.

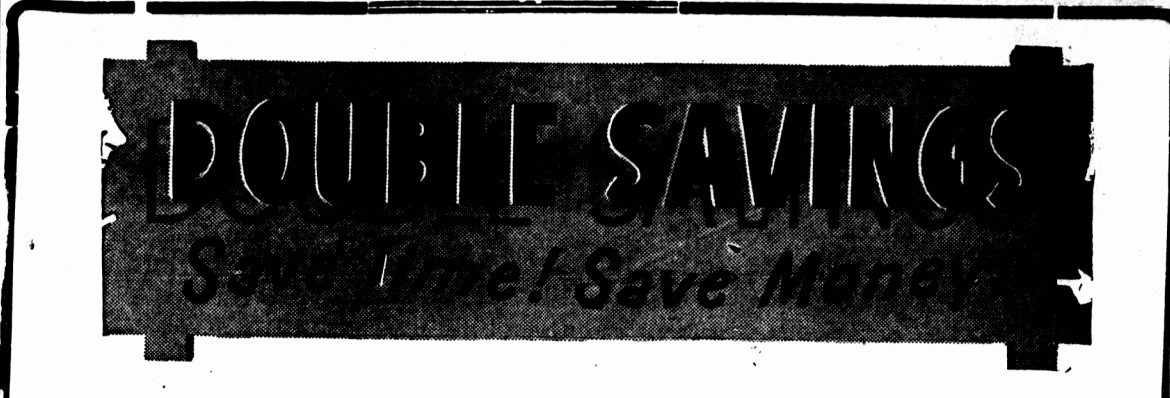
