GERMAN LEADER ADMITS SUBS, WAR CANNOT SUCCEED

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
 STOCKHOLM, via LONDON, April 1.—Dr. Albert O. W. Suedekum, one of the best known leaders of the majority Socialists in the Reichstag, in an interview here with the correspondent of the Associated Press, said that whoever thought the submarine war was going to bring England to starvation in six months was deceiving himself.

He declined to hazard a prediction on the result of the possible participation of America in the war on the side of the Entente, but added: "Anyhow, America has been virtually in the war practically since the beginning. If it had not been for American ammunition, the war would have ended in 1915."

In reference to a statement attributed to former Ambassador Gerard that the food situation might affect Germany's military strength, Dr. Suedekum said: "There is not the slightest danger of that even in the improbable event of the war lasting a year or two more. If other foods fail, we can increase our meat ration."

"We have 17,000,000 swine today, and the normal number before the war was only about 19,750,000. We have about 7,500,000 cattle, against a peace normal of about 1,000,000, or 1,500,000 more. If necessary we could butcher all but a minimum number of brood animals. It is true we are short of food but we are not starving."
