THE HAGUE, Oct. 14.—Royal household budgets these days are subject to the same economic laws as those of humbler individuals. The Queen Wilhelmina has found it necessary to notify all her employees that their salaries will be cut ten per cent. as from January 1, next.

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—Canadian skins stood out at today's session of the annual fall fur sale. Mink and otter from Quebec brought the best prices received for those varieties. Top for mink was \$21.50. Otter reached \$43; with dark Northern and Eastern Canadian pelts the most active. Southern mink and otter did not do so well, and both collections contained many Southern skins. Eastern Canadian hair seal brought nearly five dollars.
