NEW YORK, April 16.—(Special).—Mrs. Louise S. Maxwell, wife of the Military Governor of Pretoria, is making appeal to America for financial assistance for the wives and children of the Boers killed during the war.

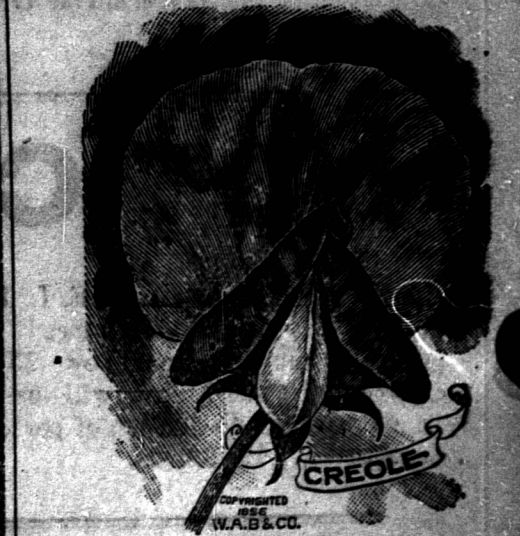
