BANDITS PLENTIFUL.
TORONTO, Feb. 23—In a letter to Rev. A. E. Armstrong, assistant secretary of the Presbyterian foreign missions, Rev. W. R. McKay, senior missionary in the South China mission, states that the province of Canton is being overrun by pirates and robbers and that some villages have been burned to the ground by the armed mobs which have been scouring the country. In regard to the two contending parties in China all was quiet in Kongmoon, the seat of the mission, but as the new year approached the peril caused by the pirates and robbers gradually increased. 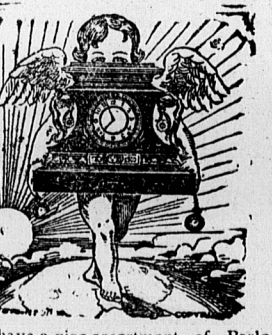
