MRS. ALPHONSUS PETERS
Many friends in Souris and vicinity mourn the passing of Mrs. Alphonsus Peters who died at the Provincial Sanatorium, Charlottetown August 24th. Born at Souris in 1893 she was the only daughter of the late John D. MacDonald and his wife Mary Ann McPhee. Growing to womanhood in her native town she was popular and well loved in a large circle of friends, and her marriage in 1943 to Mr. Alphonsus Peters of Rollo Bay had the best wishes of all. Health and happiness reigned in her home until illness in November of 1946 which later was to develop fatally. The best of loving care in home, hospital and sanatorium could not stay its progress. Death came quietly at the sleep.

Besides a sorrowing husband there is left to mourn one brother Bernard R. MacDonald of Souris. Two brothers predeceased her. The funeral which took place to St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church on Thursday August 27th was largely attended. Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Father Murray and service at the grave was conducted by Rev. A. L. Sinnott of Rollo Bay.
