REGINA, (Sask.), Feb. 8. - Further evidence from Cyril Knowles, assistant inspector of Customs preventive service, with headquarters at Winnipeg, was heard by the royal commission on customs today. Mr. Knowles told of a number of automobiles seizures which he had made from Isaac Sair and his relations and associates, some of which he said were released by Ottawa on the payment of small deposits. Inspector French, of the Royal Canadian mounted police, declared positively that there had been no drunkenness or improper conduct between customs and R. C. M. P. officers during the raid on Sair's farm near Bow, in southern Saskatchewan, some years ago, when quantities of liquor were seized. Affidavits that there had been such conduct were sent down to the customs department at Ottawa.

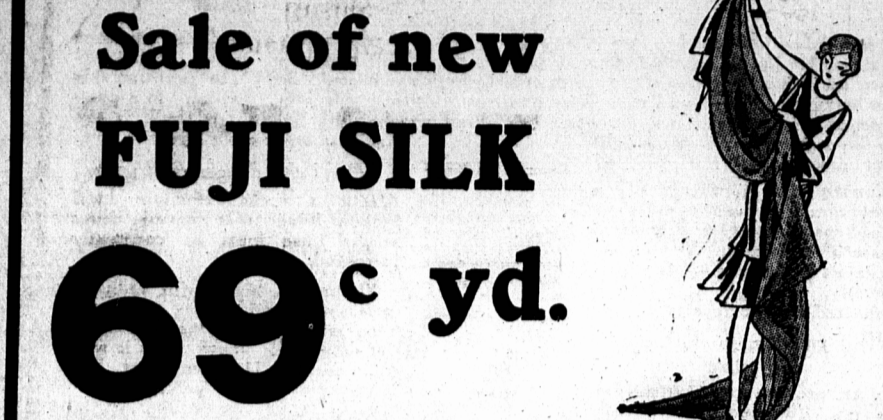
