CALL FIRST DRAFT DURING THIS WEEK. Understood Proclamation to Issue at Once.

OTTAWA, Oct. 3.—The Journal-Press understands that it is the present intention of the Government to issue this week the proclamation calling out the first army draft under the Military Service Act. It generally has been supposed that the proclamation would not be issued for some weeks yet, or until the exemption boards had been chosen, at any rate. In military circles, however, preparations are being made for the calling out of the first draft this week. The call will be for those eligible for service in the first class under the Military Service Act—single men between the ages of 20 and 36. The proclamation, it is expected, will provide that those called out will have a certain number of days

WOMAN DEAD IN SUICIDE PACT AT WINNIPEG

WINNIPEG, Sept. 27.—After lying dead on her bed for three days with a 45 bullet wound in her forehead, the body of Mrs. W. H. Hather Vancouver, was found in her room in the Royal Alexander Hotel here today. Mortification had set in. W. H. Mathar, B. A. her husband, formerly professor of Literature in Simpson College, Iowa, late of Vancouver, said to be a returned soldier in the army service corps, was in the room when the police arrived. Both his wrists had been slashed with the blade of a safety razor, which was found in the bed under the body of his wife. He was taken to the General Hospital. He will recover. One of the police officials stated that the tragedy gave every indication of being a suicide pact, but which one fired the shot that killed Mrs. Mather is not clear. It is believed that she killed herself. Mather was a returned soldier. He had been at the front and had returned to Vancouver Under the new military service act it appeared he would have to serve again. This preyed on the minds of both. They evidently were greatly attached to each other, judging by correspondence found in their room in the Hotel, and the thought of separation and the possibility that Mather would not return caused them to take steps which ended in death for the woman.
