of Commerce, a delegation of 12 has arrived in Paris for the negotiation of a commercial treaty. The first great step toward the return of stability between the two countries was marked by approval of the Dawes Plan. They will now open the first negotiations since the war for the regulation of Franco-German commercial relations which, since the war, have been governed by the Versailles Treaty.

In view of the opposing positions of France and Germany the negotiations are expected to be drawn out over a long period. France hopes to prolong the provisions of the Versailles Treaty which stipulated that for five years the products of Alsace-Lorraine should enter Germany without duty, to provide a French outlet for wines and iron and other minerals. The five-year period expires on Jan. 10, next year.

Germany, it is learned, will oppose the French desire for prolonging the free-duty period and will demand that France accord her the favored nations treatment extended to other European nations with which she has commercial treaties. So far, France has opposed granting this privilege.

Mutual concessions must be made, therefore, or the negotiations are doomed. Premier Herriot today welcomed the German delegates to the conference and entertained them at a buffet luncheon. The Germans were watched by a small crowd as they entered the Quai d'Orsay, conspicuous figures in high silk hats.

Beef Cattle

The beef cattle were judged by Mr. Robert Miller of St. John's, Ont., one of the leading Shorthorn breeders of Canada and President of the Canadian National Exhibition.

"The Shorthorns and Herefords were a good lot of practical cattle," he said when interviewed, "not in high-class show condition, but in good thrifty growing condition. There was good competition in each class, from 4 or 5 up to 10 entries. The final groups and herds were a creditable lot. The females as a whole were superior to the males. I would advise the breeders here," said Mr. Miller, "to procure better bulls. Usually these have to be bought, and it would be good business to pay more, and thereby have better herds."

The poultry exhibit is the best I have judged here, and this is my fifth season, said Mr. J. W. Clark, of Cainsville, Ont. There is a big increase in entries, 600 birds being shown this year, and there has been a marked improvement in quality over that of other years. The breeders are getting down more to the production end of the business, and are developing birds that are really profitable. The exhibit of Leghorns, Plymouth Rocks, Buff Orpingtons and Rhode Island Reds are exceptionally strong while the ducks and geese are very creditable.

The Egg Exhibit

The eggs were judged by Mr. J. G. Davidson, Dominion Poultry Representative and Mr. A. J. Logan, Dominion Egg Inspector. "Good competition and good quality especially in the single dozen entries, with the 6 dozen or 12 dozen lots not quite up to the standard," was Mr. Davidson's comment.

Roots, Vegetables and Grain

The best exhibit of roots and vegetables that I have seen for a quarter of a century, was the comment made by Mr. John Andrews, one of the judges in this department, his associate being Mr. Gordon MacMillan. They report keen competition in every section.

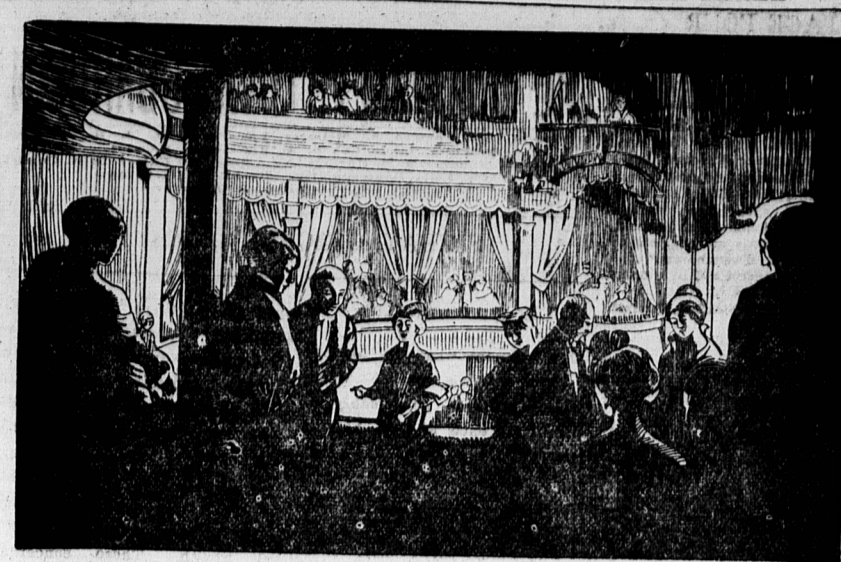
The field roots are of exceptional excellence. There is a good showing of potatoes, but there should be a revision of the prize list next year. For example, Cobblers are not specified. They are shown under the heading of "early varieties" and it is well known that the Cobbler is now king of the spuds on the Island today.

The garden vegetables are also a remarkably fine exhibit. This has been a good season for growth, and the comparatively late date of the Exhibition enables the exhibits to be shown in their maturity.

There is a pair of mammoth pumpkins exhibited which are certainly a splendid advertisement of what the Island gardens are capable of producing.
