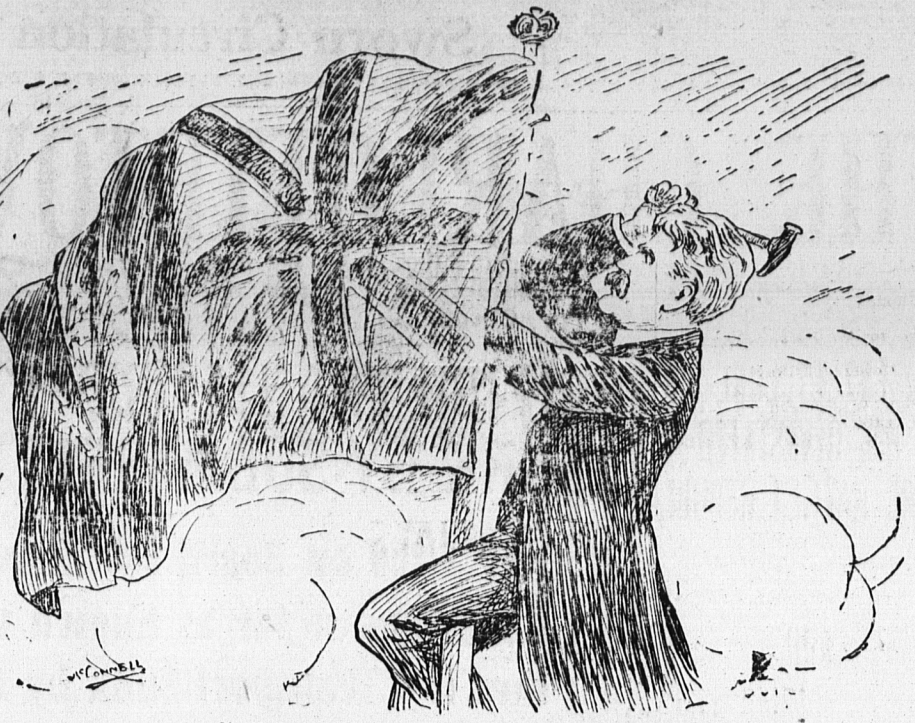
## A NEW CANADIAN REGIMENT ARRIVES SAFELY AT BERMUUDA.

HAMILTON, Bermuda, Aug. 13.—The 8th "Royal Ottawas" landed safely in Bermuda yesterday. Officers and men are in splendid condition and admiration for the regiment was expressed on every hand by the local civic and military authorities. The men will start at once on a vigorous course of final training for active service.  
Shortly after landing cable messages were despatched to the Department of Militia at Ottawa and the War Office at London.  
One week ago last Sunday the regiment, after being reviewed on Parliament Hill, left for Montreal, where they boarded the steamer. They had proceeded 100 miles down the river below Quebec when the boat was recalled and the men landed at Lewis. This was done as a precautionary measure.  
All the equipment was left on the steamer with the horses, and the vessel steamed down the gulf and around to Halifax.  
The regiment proceeded from Lewis to Halifax by rail, where they embarked at 1 p. m. last Sunday, sailing out into the darkness, with all lights extinguished, just after sunset. Yesterday morning the journey was completed in safety.  
The 38th is commanded by Lt.-Col. C. M. Edwards, of Ottawa. After training on the island they will be sent to France and replaced by one of the newer battalions. The 38th takes the place of the C. E. in Bermuda, which goes to the front after a year in the Isles of Perpetual Summer.

## SPANISH PRINCE A BANKRUPT.

NEW YORK, Aug. 16.—The embarrassing discovery that his cash capital was 28 cents, and his liabilities \$36,545.32, caused dashing Prince Ludovic Dargone Pignatelli, son of Don Jaime, Pretender to the throne of Spain, to file a petition of voluntary bankruptcy to-day in the Brooklyn Federal Court. From the time he arrived here, August 5, 1911, as the guest of Robert Goellet, at Newport, Prince Pignatelli has been stepping dramatically into the public prints every once in a while, now by becoming engaged to one or another of America's heiresses, now by running over someone in automobiles, and finally eloping with Miss Ruth Morgan Waters, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. G. Jackson Waters, of East Bank, N. J.  
It was the automobile that figured largely in placing him in his present embarrassing position. Mrs. Alice S. O'Connell got a judgment of \$15,956.86 against him July 1, in the Nassau county court, for the death of her husband, Edward, the victim of the accident.

## ST. CATHERINE GIVES GUNS TO THE 35TH REGT.

ST. CATHERINES, Ont., Aug. 16.—St. Catherine's citizens took a half holiday yesterday afternoon to receive the 35th overseas battalion (Toronto regiment), commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel McCordick, of St. Catharines, who paid a visit today. After military evolutions at Montebello park, the battalion was presented with two machine guns by the St. Catherine Bar association, and the employees of the Metal Brewing company. The battalion marched to Niagara camp this morning.

## STEEL HEAD SHIELDS WORN BY FRENCH.

PARIS, Aug. 16.—Pending the manufacture of the new steel helmets for the French army, 700,000 steel head shields have been sent to the front. This is the only species of armor that the soldiers have been permitted to use, as men in the cuirasses, chest protectors, head protectors, coats-of-mail and bucklers offered proved to be almost as dangerous as the enemy's bullets. The head shield, however, as it is used, was recently proved by statistics to have saved a great many lives.

## MANY CANADIANS GET COMMISSIONS.

LONDON, Aug. 16.—Relatives announce that Second Lieut. Duncan Hook, Lancashire Fusiliers, eldest son of Alan Hook of Cobbehill, Vancouver Island, and was a civil engineer in Canada at the outbreak of the war was killed in action on August 7.  
The following, all from Canadian divisional mounted troops, have been gazetted temporary. Second Lieutenants: Lance Corporal J. W. Bush, to Royal Scots; Private A. S. Pirrie, to Cameronians; Corporal J. Hunt, to Dorsetshire; Lance Sergeant J. Barron, to Worcestershire; Lance Corporal A. Hazell, to the Welsh Regiment; Private R. Jenkins, 19th Alberta Horse, to Gloucestershire, and Private S. Clements of the Canadian contingent, to the Loyal North Lancashire.

## INTERNMENT OF ALIENS IN INDIA.

LONDON, Aug. 16.—(Through Reuters Ottawa Agency)—The Government of India, according to a special despatch from Simla, has been obliged to adopt more drastic measures in the treatment of alien enemies throughout the Empire. The despatch says:  
"A statement describing in detail the measures for internment, surveillance and registration hitherto applied to alien enemies in India, has been issued by the Government. It states that the prolongation of the war and the bitterness aroused by German savagery have now altered the position, besides adding to the continued strain of supervision. It has accordingly been decided, with the approval of the Secretary of State for India, to repatriate all women, children and men of non-military age as soon as the necessary arrangements can be carried out."

## TO INVESTIGATE HUDSON BAY'S FISH POSSIBILITIES.

HALIFAX, Aug. 16.—At St. John's Nfld., dispatch of August 9 says: Investigation as to the possibilities of developing a commercial fishery in Hudson Bay is under way. Several foundland shipping interests. Several ships of the sealing fleet which have been engaged for exploratory work in the bay during the coming year, in connection with the Canadian government developing work at Port Nelson have been provided with equipment for careful examination of the fishing resources of the region.  
Previous explorations have shown that there are large supplies of cod in those waters. In addition there are three species of salmon in Hudson Straits and in the summer these fish are plentiful on the coast of Baffin Island and the south shores of the bay.
