LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Sept. 10.—(CP)—There were 110 cattle, 269 sheep and lambs, 884 hogs and 276 calves for sale on Montreal livestock markets today.

Cattle, lambs and grass calves were steady. In between quality of veal calves were strong. Hogs were steady to 10 cents higher.

One lot of 18 steers averaging 1275 pounds was sold at \$9.25. The balance of the cattle were mostly cows and bulls. Medium quality cows were from \$4.75 to \$5.70 and common butchers down to \$1.25. Common butchers \$2.50 to \$3.75. Good bulls sold up to \$6 and

veal calves ranged from \$7 to \$10.50 with a few tops at \$11. Good veals were \$9.75 up with medium kinds from \$9 to \$9.50. Drinkers were \$5.50 to \$7 and grassers were from \$4 to \$5.

Good ewes and wethers were \$8.75 to \$9. Back lambs were cut \$1 per cwt and culs \$2 per cwt. Sheep were \$3 to \$5.50.

Bacon hogs were \$9.25 to \$9.35 fed and watered and \$9.50 to \$9.60 off trucks. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium with the regular cuts on off grades. Sows were \$5.50 to \$6.50. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$12.35 to \$12.50 hot weight.
