Violent storm Brings death To 36 persons

TURNER Associated Press Staff Writer WASHINGTON, March 16.—(AP)—Warning that sacrifice and inconvenience lie ahead for all, President Roosevelt Saturday night made a "total victory" over the dictators the objective of an American "total effort," unflinchingly sustained, to replace the implements of warfare in the hands of nations resisting aggression.

The country must be prepared for lower profits and longer hours of labor, he said. The arm program must not be obstructed by "unnecessary strikes." The idea of "normalcy" and "business as usual" must be abandoned. There must be "no war profiteering."

The President hailed the passage of the Lease-Lend Bill by Congress as a decision ending "any attempt at appeasement in our land; the end of urging us to get along with the dictators; the end of compromise with tyranny and the forces of oppression."
