JUDGE ANGLIN IS PROMOTED

OTTAWA, Feb. 22.—Mr. Justice F. A. Anglin of the exchequer division of the Ontario high court has been appointed to the vacancy on the bench of the supreme court of Canada caused by the retirement on superannuation of Hon. James MacLennan. In making the appointment the Minister of Justice has adhered to the policy of promotion from provincial high court followed in making recent supreme court appointments. It is understood that the promotion was first offered to Justice Osler, but the latter again decided not to leave Ontario.

The vacancy on the Ontario high court bench thus caused will probably not be filled for some weeks.

OTHER APPOINTMENTS

J. H. Bertram, surveyor of customs at Toronto, has been appointed collector of customs for the port in succession to the late Peter Small.

Robert Holmes, ex-M. P., editor of the Goderich Signal, has been appointed surveyor of customs in succession to Mr. Bertram. Mr. Holmes represented West Huron in the commons from 1900 to 1904 and was a Liberal candidate the riding in the last general election. The salary of the collectorship is \$4,000 and of surveyorship \$2,100.

Hon. Senator Miller of Richmond, N. S., the senior senator of the Dominion and only one remaining of the first appointees to the senate by royal proclamation in 1867, is dangerously ill in Ottawa. Senator Miller underwent an operation for hernia yesterday and his condition in view of his advanced age is precarious.

He was a staunch supporter of movement for confederation, and was nominated a delegate to colonial conference of 1866-67, leading up to confederation, but declined the appointment.

DUTY TO GRANT A PROHIBITORY LAW

ST. JOHN, Feb. 22.—Rev. S. Howard addressed the Thorne Lodge meeting held yesterday afternoon in the Haymarket square hall. D. C. Fisher presided. The program consisted of a duet by Mrs. M. A. Thorne and A. H. Patterson, and a temperance reading by Mr. Wasson. These numbers were very much appreciated. Rev. Mr. Howard spoke of his sympathy with the work of Thorne Lodge and said that agitation along temperance lines was still needed. Part of the scripture read in the exercise spoke of bearing one another's burdens. This was the duty of Christians and was the force that led temperance people who were to some extent untouched personally by the ravages of the drink evil, to work against it. Gladstone said that the duty of government was to make it as easy as possible for men to do right, and as hard as possible for men to do wrong. With this definition of their duty before them, the speaker asked what was the course for the government of today to pursue after being asked by the people for prohibition. There was only one action for them, and that was to grant the prayer of the people.

Regarding the ill effects of the liquor traffic, Mr. Howard said they were evident every day—poverty, crime and disease. An eloquent address was closed by a statement that conditions must change soon, and the country be relieved of this traffic. Hon. Robt. Maxwell will address the meeting on next Sunday.

STRONGLY SIGNED PETITION.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 23.—In the Legislature, an enormous petition signed by twenty six thousand names, every one a bona fide elector of the province, was presented on behalf of the liquor interests, who are urging amendments to the Local Veto Law, which will mean a return to the two thirds vote to make the law applicable. They also ask that a clause be inserted in the act by which a vote may be taken once in three years and that compensation be provided for hotel men who are deprived of licenses by the local veto.

COST OF FIRES IN CANADA.

OTTAWA, Feb. 23.—According to the Labor Gazette, the total fire loss in Canada during 1908 is estimated at twenty-two million fifty-three thousand two hundred and fifty dollars. Industrial accidents to two hundred and thirty working people in Canada during last month were reported to the department. Sixty six were fatal and one hundred and sixty-four resulted in serious injuries.

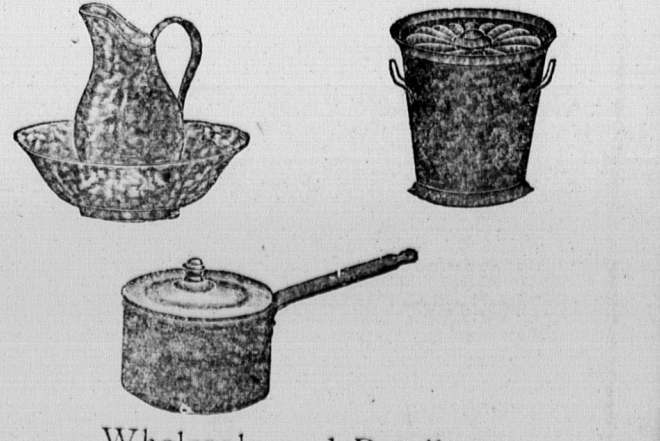

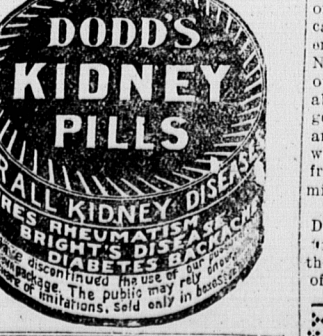

COMMERCIAL MEN WILL VOTE.

TORONTO, Feb. 23.—The Ontario government has under consideration a measure that will allow commercial travellers, lumbermen, sailors, railway men and others whose business takes them away from home a chance to vote in elections.

The plan is to provide for the issue of ballots some time before the election and the appointment of special Deputy Returning Officers to receive votes and keep them locked up in a box until election day. Some plan will be made to prevent large corporations from shipping voters out of the country at election times.
