Topic for the Week "SPIRITUAL DISCERNMENT" Thursday

"Imperfect Spiritual Ideas are but Natural"

SCRIPTURE: Read—II Corinthians 5:1-10. "For we walk by faith, not by sight" (II Cor. 5:7). "But hope that is seen is not hope; for who hopeth for that which he seeth?" (Rom. 8:24). "Their eyes were holden that they should not know him" (Lk. 24:16). "Blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed" (Jn. 20:29). See—Job 36:26; 42:5, 6; John 20:14; Acts 9:4.

MEDITATION: There are different lengths of infancy. The more important the life the longer the infancy. The lamb shares the life of the flock on its first day; the babe requires months and years. If now my life is immortal, then a physical lifetime is less than one day in the development of that life. We are learning to talk spiritually, slowly, to be sure, but as we keep on talking we grow in the power to converse.
