CLEAN WALLS FREQUENTLY
Keeping the rooms of the house fresh and bright these days is a task for the busy housewife, who has Red Cross work and other jobs to keep her going from morning till night. Re-decorating bills which many families can ill-afford, can be avoided if walls are cleaned frequently. This is not as difficult as it may seem at first. Painted or papered walls require regular dusting if dirt is not to become imbedded in the finish. Walls should be brushed lightly upwards and the cloth turned frequently. A soft cloth formed in a bag over a broom helps to get the work done more quickly and easily.

CHECK WATER SPOUTS
Check on house gutters and downspouts before leaves start falling. If gutters are of wood, tar coating should be applied every few years to preserve them. If they are of galvanized iron, a quick drying lead paint can be used as this will reduce danger of leaks through corrosion. Lead or copper gutters and downspouts do not need painting.

GLASS BAKING DISHES
Glass baking dishes need extra care to keep them clean. As soon as they have been used soak them in warm water. Scrub with a cloth dipped in fine scouring powder. Wash in hot soapy water and rinse in very hot water. Wipe with a soft cloth.

RIBBONS DECORATE BUCKLES, BROCHES
NEW YORK — Buckles and brooches make good use of bright bits of ribbon to increase their importance as ornaments. A pin you are particularly fond of set in a knot of cerise satin ribbon takes on a new significance. Old-fashioned buckles, slipped on grosgrain ribbon, or interesting buttons worn

this way, have many possibilities.

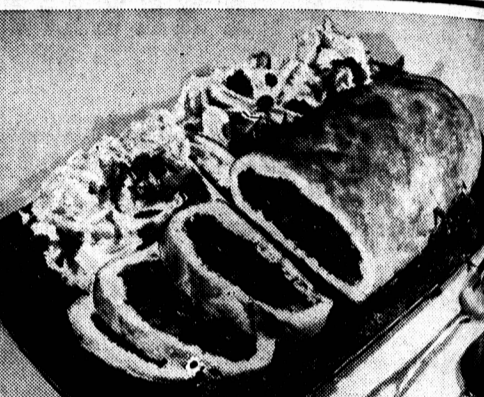

Economical Baked Meat Roll

A new and tasty way of making a main dish out of meat and vegetable left-overs.

Now that we all must make our meats go further and yet serve properly balanced meals in accordance with Canada's Nutrition Program—new, interesting ways of using left-over meat and vegetables are much in demand.

Try this baked meat roll next time you have one or two cups of meat left over. Make biscuit dough: 2 cups sifted flour, 4 tsp. baking powder, 1/2 tsp. salt, 4 tsp. Jewel Shortening, 1/2 cup milk. 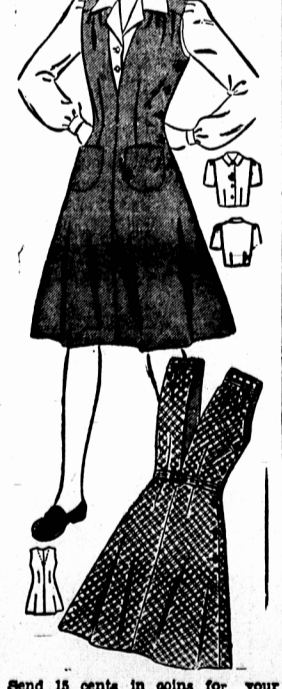

Here's delightful tapoca cream for 6 servings. Combine 3 tablespoons quick-cooking tapoca, 1-4 teaspoon salt and 2 cups milk in a saucepan. Bring mixture to boil over direct heat stirring the whole. Remove from fire. Mixture will be thin. Place one unbeaten egg white and 1-2 cup strawberry preserves or any fruit jam in bowl, and beat with rotary beater until stiff and creamy. Fold in tapoca mixture. Add 2 teaspoons lemon juice and teaspoon grated lemon rind. Pile lightly in sherbet glasses and chill.

Solo Alaskas make a pretty impressive country dessert. Beat 4 egg whites until stiff, gradually
