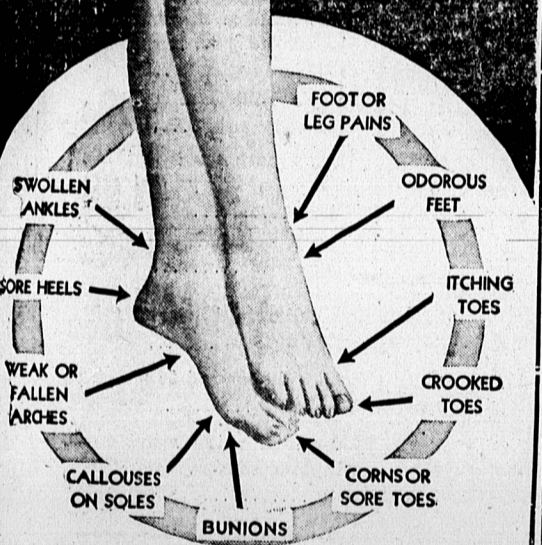

PARIS, June 17.—(U. P.)—The eyes certainly have it where veils are concerned, and veils are certainly concerned where 1931 model hats are worn, and hats—well, you see what a vicious circle it is?

Summer veils will be sheerer and in delicate colors, making them different from the ones we've worn during the last few months. They will do away with that hem line, even when it is only a thread, because whatever it is from a distance it makes the forehead look wrinkled—and heaven forbid that! With the charming new "holey" hats—that let the blessed sunshine in through holes in the top or side—veils will act as curtains over them to keep the wind from doing any possible damage to the short locks underneath.

With a few types of novelty veils the eyes will peek out through an almond-shaped opening resembling a mask. Usually it is just one eye so treated, but where the hat is the kind that sits back on the head like a sailor cap, the veil mask will be two-eyed and there will be a small scallop where it crosses the nose to guarantee its perfect fit. This may sound a little queer at first, but try it once and see how really novel it is—novel and nice.

With all-over lace hats the type of veil indicated above can be worn back over the hat while dining or dancing and pulled down before stepping into the car to go home. Thrown back it reveals the hair and a wide expanse of forehead. Brought into place it immediately evokes an elusive mystery as in the romantic days of masked balls where Prince Charming was often intrigued by the curve of a mouth below the tip of a bit of silk that concealed the eyes of its owner.

For The Cook

CREAMED BEEF WITH MUSHROOMS

Served with baked potatoes and grilled tomatoes, creamed beef with mushrooms will provide a very satisfying meat dish. To make it: Melt two tablespoons of butter in a saucepan and to it add the contents of a medium-size jar of dried beef, shredded in half-inch pieces. In another pan saute peeled fresh mushrooms (a half-pound will do), and when tender add them to the beef, which has been allowed to become slightly browned in the butter. Pour over the mixture two cups of creamy white sauce, season highly with pepper and serve over hot buttered toast.

Creamed beef and mushrooms (left over) make a delicious filling for stuffed tomatoes. Scoop out the centres of the tomatoes, fill with the beef, sprinkle the top with buttered crumbs and bake until the tomatoes are done and the crumbs are brown.

Gold Of Famed Bandit Sought After Century

ATHENS, Greece, June 16.—Treasure amassed by the notorious Ali Pasha of Tepeleni, who terrorized the Balkans 150 years ago, is being sought near Janina, in Northern Greece, where the Pasha held his court.

Working from recently discovered documents, archaeologists have found a tunnel which supposedly leads to the buried treasure. In the tunnel they discovered the skeletons of nine workmen hired by Ali and killed by him so that he alone would know the hiding place.

The splendor of Ali's court at Janina has become almost a legend throughout the Balkans. Ambassadors of the great powers came to him and the poet Byron was his guest. He was successively the ally of Napoleon and Lord Nelson. At the peak of his career his glory outshone that of the Sultan in Constantinople.

Humble Start

Yet Ali arose from a humble beginning. He was born in 1741 at Tepeleni, a hill village in Albania. His father, who held the hereditary office of bey of Tepeleni, was killed by neighboring chiefs who seized his territory when Ali was fourteen years old.

All was left in the care of his mother, Khanko, a woman of extraordinary character. She herself formed a brigand band and inspired the boy with her own fierce temper.

Within a few years he regained possession of Tepeleni and took vengeance on his enemies. Then, to secure his own power, he murder-

ed his brother and imprisoned his mother on a charge of attempting to poison him.

In Russian War

In 1787 Ali took part in the war against Russia and was rewarded by being made Pasha of Trikala in Thessaly and Derwend-Pasha of Rumelia. His power was augmented when he succeeded in being nominated Pasha of Janina.

It was only natural that his power should arouse the jealousy of the Sultan Mahmud II, who had formulated a policy of curbing the strength of the provincial pashas.

The Sultan's pretext for an attack on Ali came in 1820 when the "Lion of Janina" violated the sanctity of Istanbul itself by attempting to procure the murder of an enemy in the very precincts of the Sultan's palace. The bulk of the Pasha was sent against him.

Although over eighty, he held his own for two years. He was forced to sue for peace in the spring of 1822.

He was granted an interview with Khursid Pasha, was received and dismissed with friendly assurances. As he turned to leave the tent, he was stabbed in the back. Then his head was cut off and sent to Constantinople.

Although Ali was known to have amassed much treasure, the existence of a buried hoard was considered a legend until the recent discovery of the documents. Now the discovery of the tunnel has stimulated efforts to find the treasure.

EXPERTS DECLARE OHIO LOCUST HORDE HARMLESS COLUMBUS, O., June 16.—(U.P.)

No alarm need be felt over the advent of the 17-year "locust" breed of 1931, which is now making its appearance in Ohio and a portion of Pennsylvania and West Virginia, according to experts at Ohio State University.

The experts explained that the 17-year locust was really a cicada, and an almost harmless relative to the harvest fly, although appearing formidable because of the noise made by it and the large numbers in which the breed appear.

Records available in Ohio show that the 17-year locust invaded the state in 1829, 17046, 1963, 1897 and 1914.
