**\$500,000 GIFT
 WAS WITHDRAWN**

CINCINNATI, O., Feb. 9.—William C. Procter announced tonight that he had withdrawn his offer of \$500,000 for the proposed graduate college of Princeton University. The offer was made last May with the understanding that an additional half million dollars was to be raised by May 1, 1910.

Mr. Procter said tonight that his offer had been unconditionally withdrawn on account of his inability to agree with the views entertained by President Woodrow Wilson and members of the Princeton faculty as to the scope and institution of the graduate college. He declared that the matter had been under discussion for six years, but that there was not any likelihood that a definite plan would be agreed upon.
