built in this rock-ribbed canyon, which is itself a natural amphitheatre.

Echo canyon's acoustics are so perfect that an ordinary conversational tone will carry faithfully for 600 feet. The thinnest note of a high-pitched violin will penetrate into the canyon's innermost recesses. A cliff acts as a natural sounding-board. Opposite it a talus slope will afford graduated elevations for spectators' seats.

The Echo Canyon Bowl association, sponsor of the project, plans to provide seating facilities for 5,000 persons and eventually, for 25,000.

The canyon is about eight miles from Phoenix.

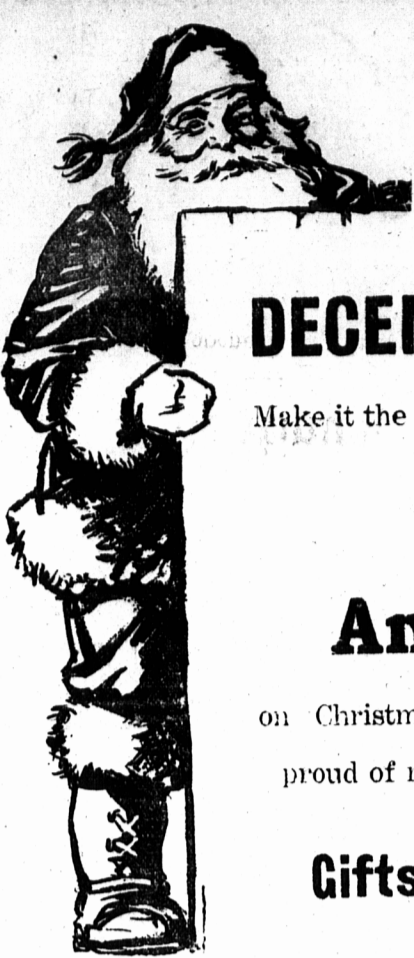
