ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH DISAPPEARANCE OF CANADIAN MILLIONAIRE.

With the arrest of John Doughty, formerly secretary to Ambrose J. Small, Toronto, theatre Magnate who disappeared mysteriously nearly a year ago, one of the most sensational cases of the last decade is believed to be near solution. Doughty disappeared at the same time as his elderly employer, with \$100,000 in bonds. Small had just been paid more than \$1,000,000 in a theatrical deal. Bill Sharon And The Pacing Strain

In concluding an interesting article of the Canadian trotter, Bill Sharon 2.11 1/4, whose bloodlines in certain respects are akin to those of Uhlán, 1.58, a contemporary says: "At the roots of both material lines we find saddle or pacing blood."

For years the Breeder has called attention to the unquestionable influence of pacing blood in the making of a considerable number of eminent trotters; and more recently it has emphasized the fact that Dillon Axworthy, 3. 2.10 1/4 a champion sire of extreme and early speed for his years, has a pacer for his dam. That the mares in the pedigree of Peter the Great—a speed sire of surpassing excellence and now looming large, as a probable progenitor of the better sort—are entitled to more credit for what the horse has accomplished than are the chief sires—Pilot Medium, Happy Medium and Grand Sentinel—is the opinion of many horsemen and breeders, and when one considers that Santos (dam of Peter the Great) has accomplished and then regards the work of Tackey, daughter of Pilot, Jr., the pacing-bred trotter and founder of a great brood mare family which furnished the first two 2.10 trotters, this belief in the potency of pacing blood in the making of trotters and sires looks to be well founded.

Santos carried a saddle strain and also one to Pilot, Jr., giving her son, Peter the Great, two crosses of the last named horse.

Yes, pacing blood, or rather, the blood of horses that pace, will produce great trotters and sires. American Horse Breeder.



Dempsey Knocks Brennan Out In 12th Round

MADISON SQUARE GARDEN, New York, Dec. 15.—Jack Dempsey world's heavyweight champion knocked out Bill Brennan of Chicago last night in the 12th round of the first heavyweight championship fight staged in New York since the Walker law became operative.

THE MARKETS

MONTREAL, Dec. 11.—The receipt of eggs today were 72 cases, as against 103 cases for the same day last week and 65 cases for the corresponding day a year ago. According to cable advices received from London this week, the market has been quiet and weaker, with prices for Canadian storage stock 2s to 3s lower than a week ago at 35s to 36s and American eggs at 35s while in the Liverpool market Canadian storage eggs are quoted at 37s. Glasgow cables report arrivals of Canadian and American eggs heavy, which are meeting with a fair demand at unchanged prices.

We quote wholesale jobbing prices as follows:— Strictly new laid eggs . . . 85c to 90c Selected C. S. Stock . . . 72c No. 1. C. S. . . . 64c No. 2. C. S. Stock . . . 52c to 54c There was no important change in the condition of the market for dressed poultry today, prices for all lines being maintained and, as the prospects are that there will be an urgent demand for supplies during the balance of the month, the feeling will likely remain firm, providing favorable weather prevails. The trade today was rather quiet, as is usually the case at the close of the week, owing to the fact that buyers generally had provided for their wants. The prospects are that there will be a keen demand from now on for turkeys, geese, and chickens for the holiday trade.

We quote wholesale prices as follows: Choice turkeys, per lb . . . 51c to 52c Good turkeys . . . 48c to 50c Chickens . . . 32c to 35c Fowl . . . 25c to 30c Geese . . . 29c to 31c Ducks . . . 36c to 40c There was no further change in the market for potatoes today, but the undertone is easy and the impression of some in the trade is that prices will go still lower in the near future unless the demand

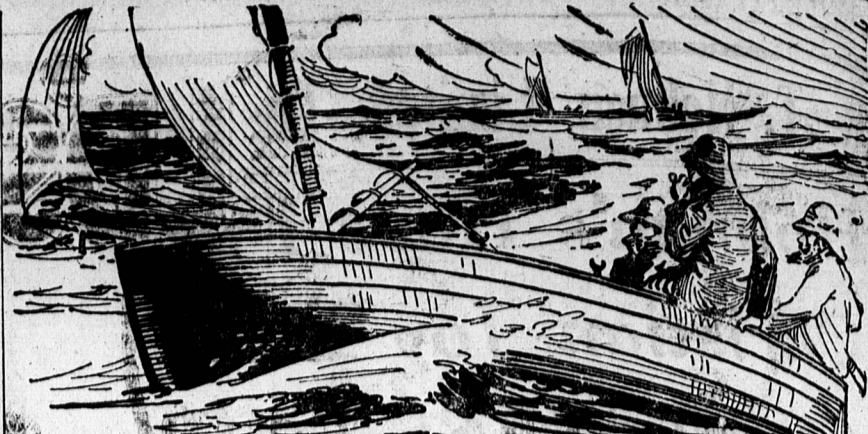

The offerings today were fair, which met with a slow sale, and the trade was quiet, with car lots of Quebec stock quoted at \$1.60 to \$1.70 per bag of ninety pounds, extra and in a wholesale jobbing way at \$1.80 to \$1.90 per bag of 80 lbs., ex-store, while Green Mountains sold at \$2.
