The delegation will proceed to Ottawa as soon as practicable. The Halifax city council also will be asked to send a delegate to accompany the delegates from Cape Breton.

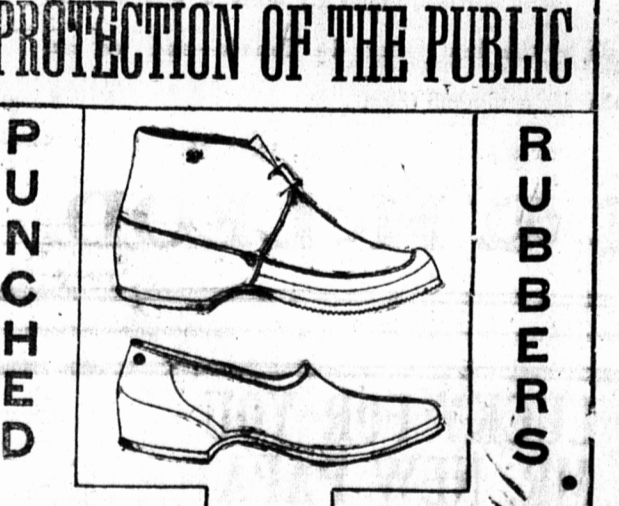
