### THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

#### REMEMBER THE SABBATH DAY TO KEEP IT HOLY.

SIR.—The Confession of Faith of the Presbyterian Church says: See Chapter 1, page 8:—

"Although the light of nature, and the works of creation and providence, do so far manifest the goodness, wisdom and power of God as to leave men inexcusable—Rom. 2:14, 15; Rom. 1:19, 20; Ps. 19: 1-3—yet are they not sufficient to give that knowledge of God, and of His will, which is necessary unto salvation—1. Cor. 1:21; Cor. 2:13, 14—therefore He pleased the Lord at sundry times, and in diverse manners, to reveal Himself and to declare His will unto His church—Heb. 1:1—and afterwards for the better preserving and propagating of the truth, and for the more sure establishment and comfort of the church against the corruption of the flesh and the malice of Satan and of the world, to commit His word wholly unto writing—Luke 1:3, 4; Rom. 15: 4; 1. Cor. 13: 10; Rev. 22: 18;—which maketh the Holy Scripture to be most necessary—2 Tim. 3: 15; 2 Pet. 1: 19—those former ways of God's revealing His will unto His people being now ceased—Heb. 1: 1, 2.

"II. Under the name of Holy Scripture, or the word of God written, are now contained all the books of the Old and New Testaments, which are these: Genes's, Exodus, and so on as found in the versions commonly known as King James and Revised.

"All which are given by inspiration of God, to be the rule of Faith and Life—Eph. 2: 20; Rev. 22: 18, 19; 2 Tim. 3: 16.

"IV. The authority of the Holy Scripture, for which it ought to be believed and obeyed, dependeth not upon the testimony of any man or church, but wholly upon God (Who is truth itself) the Author thereof; and therefore it is to be received, because it is the word of God—2 Tim. 3: 16; 1 Joh. 5: 9; 1 Thess. 2: 13."

"I quote now from Rules and Forms of Procedure in the church courts of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, Page 76: Questions to be put to ministers at ordination or induction:

"1. Do you believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and the only infallible rule of faith and manner?" To which Rev. Mr. Fullerton responded, "at the time of his induction in a clear voice, "I do."

"2. Do you believe the Westminster Confession of Faith, as adopted by this church in the Basis of Union, to be founded on and agreeable to the Word of God, and in your teaching will you faithfully adhere thereto?"

Again, as before, the Reverend Gentleman replied in tones decided: "I do," and "I will."

Now according to a report of a sermon of his, delivered in St. James Church, on the evening of the Lord's Day, Dec. 14th, and appearing in the Patriot newspaper the following Tuesday, the Rev. Mr. Fullerton said:

"The law of the Sabbath as laid down in the book of Exodus is based on a tradition about creation wholly irreconcilable with historic and scientific fact; for as the question must be decided in harmony with the light of freedom of the teaching of Christ. Christ is our authority and our law giver—not Moses." (Remember, Mr. Editor, "the Scriptures cannot be broken," see John 10:35. The Writer); "Even to the Jew," Mr. Fullerton proceeds, "this commandment has not an equal moral sanction with the other commandments which are indisputably weightier matters of the law and which have been redited at one time or another in the teachings of Christ Himself. To get at the principle of the day we must see ourselves from its Judaistic associations and refuse to be dictated to by the dogmatism of creeds as to what we shall think or what we shall do. There is no better reason for setting apart one day in seven than that contained in the idea of rest. There lies within it a law of human nature which applies alike to body and spirit; we need rest and in the proportion of one in seven. This position is supported by medical and mental science, which have approached the subject from the merely scientific point of view."

Presbyterians of P. E. Island near and far, yes, Presbyterians of the wide Dominion, remotest and close, what do you think of that! Does it take away your breath? What does the Presbytery of this Province, the Synod of the Maritime Provinces, nay the General Assembly of all the Provinces think of it? A minister within the pale of the Presbyterian Church, eating her bread and enjoying her blessings, privileges and immunities to so talk! O-hates of Calvin, of Knox, of Chalmer! What is the face of the man who swearing allegiance to his King and country, hits conscious or otherwise deadly blows at her autonomy? "If the foundations be destroyed what can the righteous do?"

From the standpoint of truth, the man making such averments, has no foundation whatever to stand upon. But passing the matter of truth over what of loyalty to the church?

As a humble member of the great Presbyterian Church, heartily subscribing to every article of her matchless standards, than whom there can be no more loyal citizen—as bearing a hearty, firm and loving obedience to the old blue Flag which has ever stood for freedom, equality, justice, and purity of doctrine—principles which our Scottish forefathers
