CHARLOTTETOWN

EDINBURGH, Scotland, July 23. Armgard Karl Graves, a German, was found guilty today by the Scottish High Court of Judiciary on a charge of spying. He was sentenced to eight months imprisonment. Not regarding guns under construction in the British Government arsenals and other incriminating documents.

BEAM TRAWLING TO BE INVESTED.

OTTAWA, July 23.—The Canadian department of fisheries is co-operating with the Newfoundland and United States fisheries authorities in endeavoring to reach some joint agreement as to the abolition of steam trawling in Atlantic coast waters. The matter has been before the government here for years, but the difficulties in the way of securing joint international action have so far prevented any satisfactory arrangement to prevent the admitted and growing menace of steam trawling both in regard to the gear of the regular fishermen and in regard to the conservation of the fisheries. Now all three governments have signified readiness to co-operate in checking steam trawling as far as possible. The department here has placed two officers on board steam trawlers now operating off the maritime provinces and they will report as to conditions. Similar action has been taken by the American and Newfoundland departments. It is hoped that joint legislation in the matter may be secured during the course of next year.

FOUR HUNDRED FENIAN CLAIMS PAID.
OTTAWA, July 23.—Some four hundred claims for the Fenian raids bounty of \$100 granted at the last session of parliament, have been paid up to the present by the finance department. Some 3,000 claims have been passed by the militia department and forwarded to the finance department out of over 250,000 applications received. The auditor-general is however delaying payment in many cases, pending further proof of the bona fides of the applicants, hence the delay in forwarding the grant to those still on the list as forwarded by the militia department.


