CHICAGO, April 11—(AP)—Buying that lifted wheat prices about a cent was resumed in the grain pits today as traders sought to get a late the latest war developments. Wheat, closed 1-3-3/4 cents higher, May 1.07 1/2—1.4, July 1.06 5/8—1.2; Corn 3-8-3/4 up, May 59 1/2, July 60 3/4; Oats 1-8 off to 1 1/2 higher. WINNIPEG, April 11—(CP)—Minor support through practically all houses established a firm tone in a dull Winnipeg grain exchange session today. Closing wheat futures quotations were 1-4-3/8 higher with May at 89 7/8, July 91 1/4 and Oct 92 7/8 cents. Buenos Aires was up 3-8-5/8 cent at mid-day.

MINING

TORONTO, April 11—(CP)—In the slowest trading day in a week the market on the Toronto stock exchange generally churned around in narrow range with a few golds attracting chief attention. The gold gains recorded the previous day. Total transactions at 521,000 shares were 188,000 below Wednesday's turnover. Bidgood on sales of 127,000 shares closed at 48, up 5 cent. Up-ber Canada gained 2 cents to 88. The gold index closed slightly lower. San Antonio lost 4 cents. Base metals also sagged in the indices while industrials and western oils showed improvement. Home Oil was up 7 cents. Other firm spots were Anglo Canadian and Davies & Pete. Texas and United were weak. In base metals weak spots were Bend Oreille, Ventures, Sudbury Basin, Alderco, Sherritt Gordon and Steen Rock. Ventures lost 10 cents. Consolidated Smelters weakened a fraction, while both Nickel and Falconbridge were higher.

FINANCE

By Frederick Gardner Associated Press Financial Writer NEW YORK, April 11—(AP)—Advancing "war babies" managed to give a forward push to the stock market averages today, but traders avoided wide-scale operations. Winston Churchill and his speech to Parliament seemed to serve as the main drag on Wall Street proceedings. Instead of sweeping claims of victory, Churchill emphasized sober advice to neutrals. Early gains were almost erased. The Associated Press average of 60 selected stocks ended the session 2 of a point higher at 508. Transactions totalled only 889,690 shares compared with 1,287,280 yesterday. Canadian issues followed a steadier trend. Distillers, International Nickel, Walkers, Brazilian, Marconi and Lake Shore improved fractions. Hollinger and Imperial Oil were easy. Reported new Allied orders for American-built fighting planes gave a natural impetus to air stocks and steels were buoyed by hopes that the British and French would strengthen their sea supremacy. Rating among the leaders of the upside were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Chrysler, Lockheed, Douglas, United Aircraft, Dressed Manufacturing, East Allied Chemical, Westinghouse, American Smelting, Kennecott, Santa Fe, Great Northern preferred, New York Shipbuilding and U. S. Rubber.
